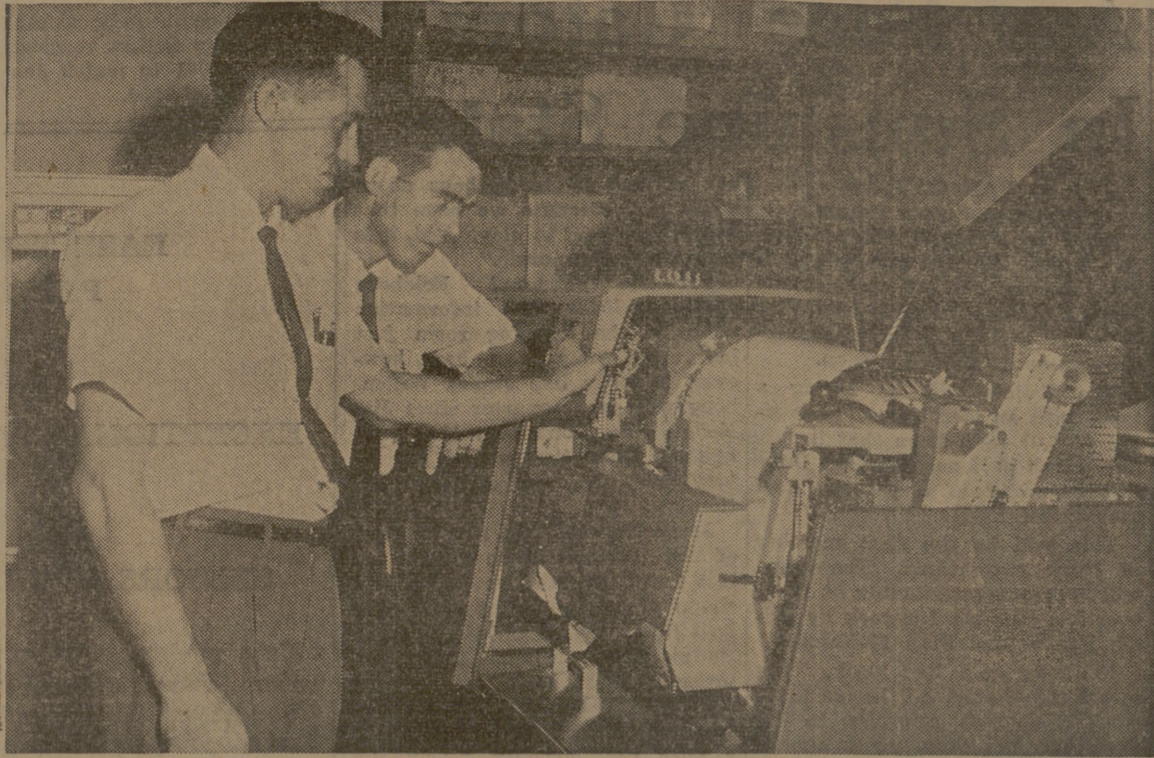

## IBM Computer Figures College, System Payroll

The Data Processing Center assists in the preparation of payrolls as well as in research projects.

The electronic assistance comes in handy for the fiscal department payroll section, which prepared records of 73,000 checks valued at approximately \$10.8 million during the fiscal year ending Aug. 31.

Details associated with preparing the various payrolls handled by the fiscal department keep four persons busy, without considering the hours spent at the Data Processing Center.

Detailed work concerning the varying payroll deductions for employees adds up to a large amount of work. This is especially true of the September payroll said Walter F. Berndt, fiscal department auditor, and Billy J. Barker, payroll supervisor.

Hours of nights and weekend work during September was concluded at 3 a.m., Sept. 24. At 5:30 the same morning George Litton of the fiscal department took necessary records to Austin.

The messenger delivers the checks to the fiscal department a few days later.

"In order to get the state warrants by the last day of the month, we should have the payrolls in

Austin by the eighteenth of the month," Berndt said. He said in September his staff customarily does work normally handled in the more than 100 departments submitting payrolls.

Barker and his staff handle the payrolls for the administrative and general officers of the A&M System, all departments of A&M, the Texas Engineering Extension Service, Texas Engineering Experiment Station and Texas Transportation Institute.

Details concerning the budgeted payroll personnel are handled by Barker. Bill Jaska assists Barker and also is responsible for the semimonthly and student labor payrolls. Mrs. Patricia Schaefer normally handles the weekly payroll and Mrs. Barbara Brown attends to the insurance programs deductions on all payrolls.

Payroll matters at the Data Processing Center are the responsibility of James B. Fickey, tabulating equipment operator. He operates an IBM 1405 Printer capable of printing 600 lines of characters in one minute.

Over 100 college officials, representing 105 Texas senior and junior colleges, will be on campus Monday and Tuesday for the 19th Annual Junior College Conference at the Memorial Student Center.

The conference, with Dr. C. H. Ransdell, assistant dean of engineering as chairman, will be divided into two sections. The theme for Monday's program is "Expanding Roles for the Junior College," while Tuesday's theme will be "Agency Study of New Roles for Junior Colleges."

Established to coordinate the two-year and four-year colleges, the conference will be attended by the various schools' presidents, deans and staff.

Monday's program will open at 9 a.m. in the MSC Assembly Room. Dr. William Graff, dean of instruction, will welcome the college officials, while Dr. A. S. Brumbaugh, consultant, Southern Regional Education Board, will deliver the opening address, titled "The Role of Junior Colleges in Higher Education of the South."
