Aggie prickly pear jam will be sold in the Bryan-College Station area during December as an unusual Christmas gift or delicacy.

Members of the Horticulture Club have 300 pounds of singed prickly pear ready to put in containers.

"Extractions from the prickly pear of cactus make a delicatessen

jam," James Demont, president of the club said.

Actually, prickly pear jam was first made by students in 1956, Dr. E. E. Burns, associate professor of horticulture, recalls.

Since then the "delicacy" has been recognized by the Food and Drug Administration. Several commercial firms have produced different types of jams or jellies recently.

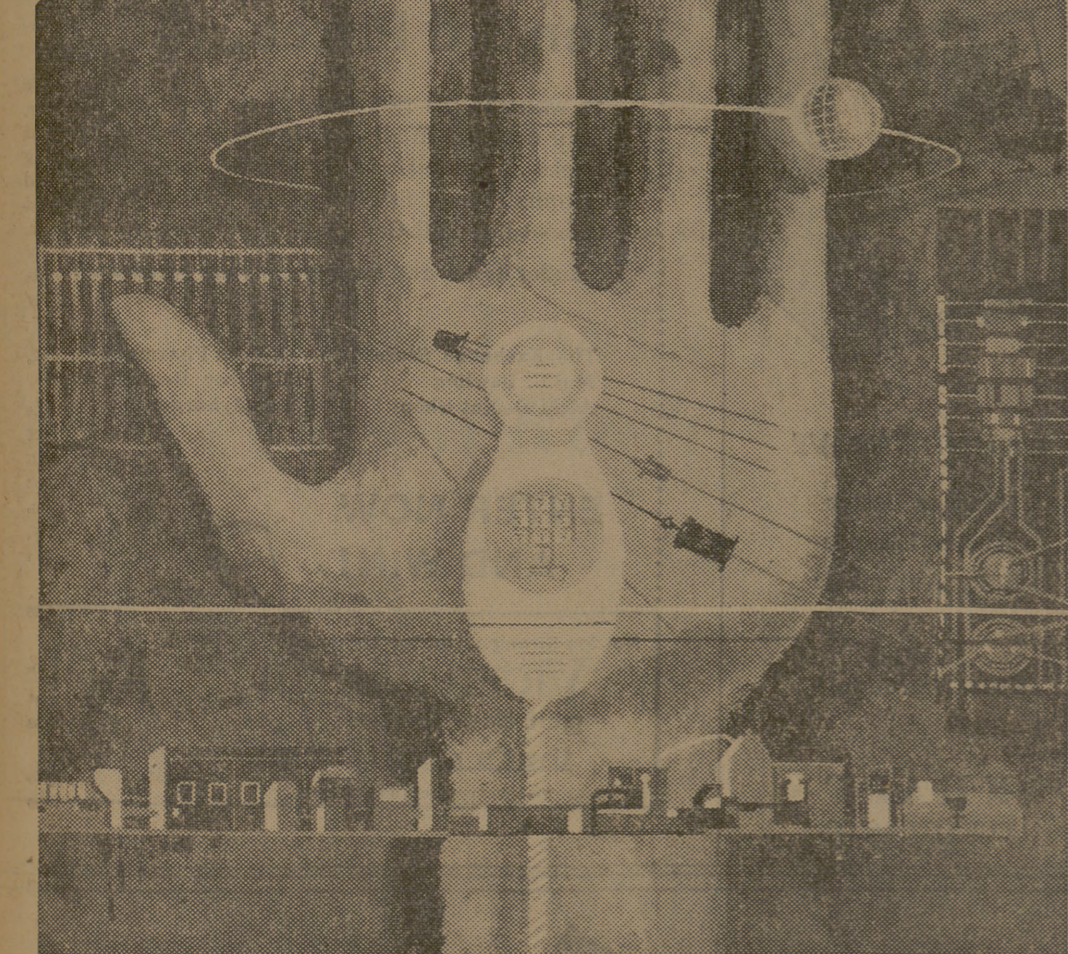

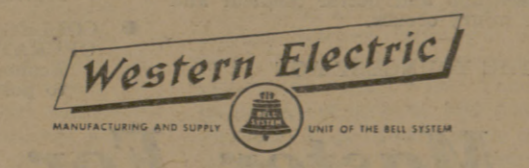
