

CADETS STILL IN RACE

Clark Bombs Baylor Bears, Ags Spoil Homecoming, 6-3

Mike Clark, A&M's one-man demolition crew, wrecked Baylor's Homecoming spirit with his second and third field goals of the season as the Aggies took a last-minute 6-3 SWC victory over the Bears in Waco Saturday night.

A crowd of 35,000, including 5,000 Baylor exes, stomped and shouted as the Bears drove again and again deep into Aggie terri-

tory only to be stopped by the Cadet defense.

Baylor won the toss and elected to kick off with a gusty 15 m.p.h. wind at its back. Aggie halfback George Hargett took the kick on the 3-yard line and returned it to the A&M 28.

A&M moved for a first down on the Baylor 41 before having to punt. Quarterback Jim Keller kicked 32 yards to the Bears' Ronnie Goodwin, who ran it back to

the Baptist 37.

On Baylor's second play from scrimmage, Don Trull dropped back and hit Goodwin for 44 yards and the Bears were on the Aggie 14.

THREE PLAYS later, with Trull holding, Carl Choate set the pattern for the night by splitting the goal posts with a 23-yard field goal.

Jim Linnstaedter got the kickoff for the Farmers and returned 35 yards to the A&M 42.

With a first-and-ten from the Baylor 17, Jim Willenborg pitched back to Linnstaedter, who fumbled, and Butch Maples recovered for the Bears to end the Aggie threat. The Aggies spent the remaining minutes of the first half deep in their own end of the field, stopping one Baylor drive on the 17.

THE SECOND HALF took up where the first half left off, with the Cadets stopping the Bears on the A&M 25. Choate missed a 32-yard field goal attempt to end Baylor's last offensive threat.

The clock showed 11:20 left to play when the Maroon got the ball on its own 47. Fourteen plays later, Clark trotted onto the field and booted the tying three-pointer.

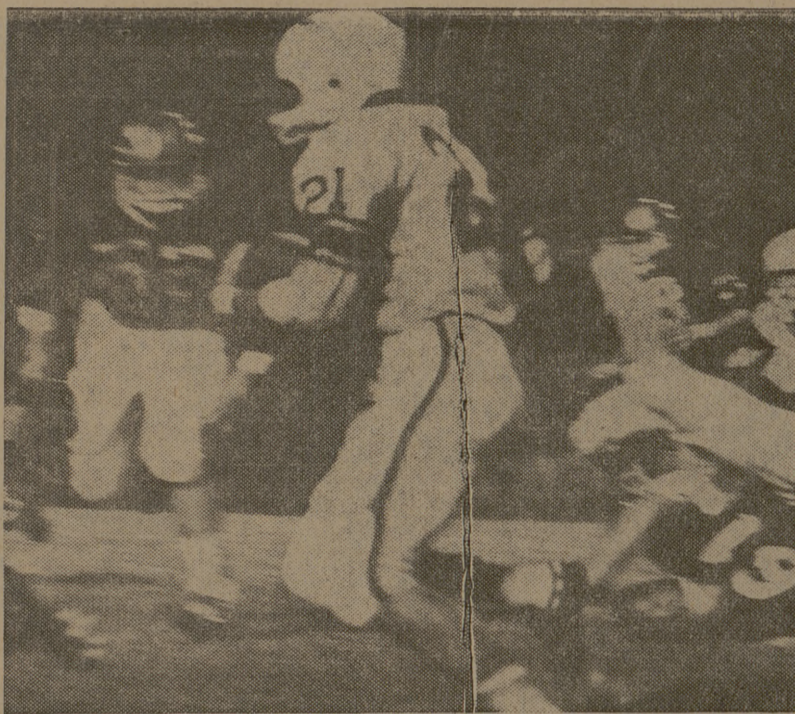
Since a tie or loss would mean elimination from the SWC race for either team, Baylor put its hopes on Trull's passing arm, but to no avail. The Aggie line was calling the shots.

After giving no ground in two Baylor possessions, the Aggies put the ball in play on their own 41 with 1:09 on the clock.

ON SECOND DOWN, Keller completed his first pass of the game to Hargett for 44 yards to the Bear 15.

A&M drew a five-yard penalty for too much time and Keller was dropped for a five-yard loss, bringing up third down.

The only sound was the strong wind at Clark's back as No. 86 doubled A&M's point total with the 42-yard field goal.

Ener, Bilgutay, Tie For 1st As Thinclads Beat Longhorns

E. L. Ener and Ilhan Bilgutay teamed up Saturday to defeat the Texas Longhorns in a dual cross-country meet on the A&M course. The Fish lost their two-mile race with the Shorthorns.

Ener and Bilgutay tied for first in the meet with times of 14:16. This is the fastest three-mile time for either of the distancemen this season.

Texas' Steve Strickland turned in a 14:34.0 to cop third. The Ags won, 25-30.

Richard Romo of the Shorthorns won the two-mile with a 9:23.0 effort. The Texas frosh won 23-32. Aggie Gene Westmoreland was second with 9:35.0.

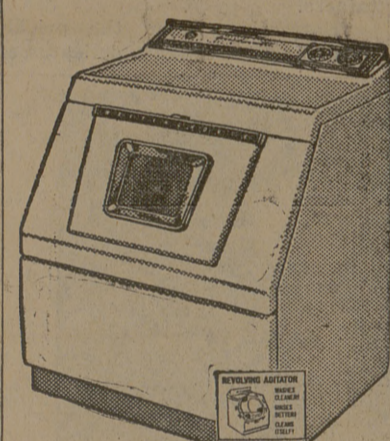
The meet also featured a high school division in which Westbury of Houston had low points and Brian Woolsey of Fort Worth Castleberry won individual honors with a 9:50.8.

AFCA Lists Steer Tackle

Among the 17 new candidates added to the American Football Coaches Association list of All-America nominees is Scott Appleton, 227-pound tackle for the Texas Longhorns, making it six SWC picks.

The 6-3 Appleton is the third Steer to make this season's list. He joins guard Johnny Treadwell and fullback Ray Poage.

A&M's Jerry Hopkins is listed as one of four centers who have a bid for the national honors.

Quarterbacks Sonny Gibbs, TCU and Billy Moore of Arizona are also contenders. More than 500 head coaches, using evaluations furnished by analyzing game film, will pick the honored first, second and third All-America players. Their decision will be released Dec. 1.

The University of Texas football team has 26 lettermen back this season.
