Editor, The Battalion:
 On behalf of the married students I wish to speak out against a recent Battalion news article which stated that according to a poll, students tend to favor a hike in tuition. This so-called poll did not represent the married or graduate student, but contained only 10 undergraduate student interviews; of these, only two were out-of-state students. This is not a cross-sectional representation of the student body.

It should be brought to light that single students need only to support themselves and this is largely accomplished through parental care. Why not ask the parents of these students if they would mind giving more of their hard-earned cash for tuition?

Many married students are barely able to eke out an existence while attending school and an increase in tuition would greatly increase their difficulties. Besides, married students' wives, whether they have a college education or not, are forced to work for less than mediocre wages. Undoubtedly this geographic area, on a basis of employee's wages, falls on the extreme low end of the national scale. Hence, tuition, especially for out-of-state students, represents a substantial percentage of their yearly income.

Let us heed the important aspect stressed by Governor Richard Coke in 1876 in his address at the opening of this college: "It has been the constant aim of the board . . . to bring down to the lowest possible figure the cost of an education . . ." In attempting to adhere to the principles of the original founders, the A&M student can now and has been able in the past, to proudly boast, high quality education, at the lowest possible cost. How long will he be able to make this unique claim?
