

# Dairymen Short Course Date Set

The 1962 Dairymen's Short Course will be held Nov. 29-30, according to A. M. Meekma, extension dairy specialist.

This year's program will give Texas dairymen up-to-date information on dairy cattle feeding, breeding and management as well as the marketing of milk and milk products, he stated.

The course will feature such subjects as the importance of managed milking practices, practical reproductive management, quality forage production, marketing and advertising and new innovations in dairy research.

Dr. Veal R. Smith, Head of the Department of Dairy Science at the University of Arizona, will be the keynote speaker at this year's short course. Smith, before becoming head of the Department of Dairy Science at Arizona, served as a member of the dairy faculty at the University of Minnesota and at the University of Wisconsin.

He is the author of many publications on dairy science and is one of the nation's authorities in the field of milk secretion. In addition to Smith, other speakers will discuss subjects of interest to Texas dairymen, Meekma said.

Meekma urged all Texas dairy-

men and other persons interested in the Texas dairy industry to make plans to attend the 1962 Dairymen's Short Course. Headquarters for the short course will be the Memorial Student Center.

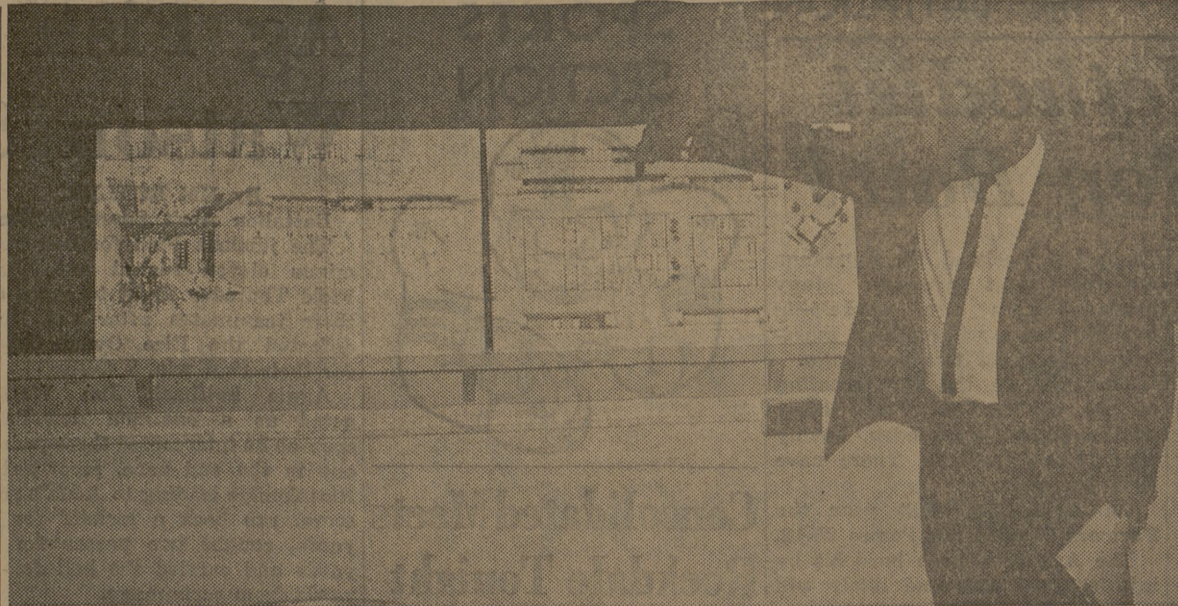
The grand jury met with the committee and House Speaker James A. Turman for nearly two hours Thursday.
