

Lenox Leads Ag Scoring, Windham Tops Rebounding

Bob Rogers' outside sharp-shooter, Bennie Lenox, leads A&M basketball scoring for both season and Southwest Conference play at the midway point in the 1963 campaign.

The 6-2 junior from League City has scored 274 points in 13 games for a 21.1 per game average and has a total of 71 points in four SWC outings for a 17.8 average.

High games for Lenox have been against Michigan and Virginia, 31 points each. His conference high is 21 against SMU.

JERRY WINDHAM, 6-6 forward from Hamilton, is the second leading point-maker for the season with 147 in ten games and heads the team's rebounding with 106. Windham missed three games with a leg injury. His per game average is 14.7.

Gerald Woodard, 6-3 forward from Dry Prong, La., has scored 132 points for a 10.2 average and Lee Walker, 6-7 center from Three Rivers, has 121 for a 9.3 norm.

Walker is the second leading re-

bounder with 94, followed by Woodard with 74 and 7-foot Lewis Qualls with 73.

Walker owns the best field goal shooting percentage, 41 of 76 for 54 per cent and has hit 16 of 26 in SWC play for 62 per cent. Lenox has proved the best free throw artist among players having shot 25 or more times. His percentage is 79 (76 of 96).

ROGERS' AGGIES lead in all statistical departments over their opponents and own records of 10-3 for the year and 3-1 in SWC action.

A&M is hitting at a 44 per cent clip from the field (350-801) and 73 per cent from the free throw line (251-344). Aggie opponents own a field goal shooting percentage of 39 (309-798) and have connected on 68 per cent of their gratis tosses (226-335).

The statistics show A&M with a wide rebounding edge, 608 to 524, and a per-game scoring average of 73.2 to their foes' 64.9.

It's mid-term examination time in the SWC and the Aggies have a short vacation from court activity.

The Cadets move back into action Jan. 30 against the University of Houston at the Houston Coliseum.

NEXT SWC TEST for A&M is against the Arkansas Razorbacks at Fayetteville Feb. 2. Then the Aggies host league-leading Texas at G. Rollie White Coliseum Feb. 5. A&M will be going after its 31st consecutive victory at home in that one.

Rogers hails the mid-term lull as "just what the doctor ordered."

He said the break in the schedule will give his team, hampered somewhat by illness and injury, a chance to get into better condition prior to the next tipoff.

Rogers is especially interested in getting Windham, the senior team captain, back in A-1 shape. Windham's play has been hampered since injury to a muscle in his left leg in the LSU game sidelined him.

Lace Panties, Bare Shoulder Now In Tennis

LONDON (AP) — The man who designed the first pair of lace panties for Wimbledon's tennis courts today unveiled a revolutionary tennis dress. It has a bare strapless shoulder.

"But only one shoulder will be bare," said Col. Teddy Tinting. "The other will be partly covered."

Years ago Tinting tailored a pair of lace-trimmed panties for America's gorgeous Gussie Moran. She didn't win the Wimbledon title but she made news all over the world.

A designer of sports clothes, Tinting said he has named the new off-one-shoulder dress "the Grecian line."

Reminded that Wimbledon's management committee last October banned colored panties from future tournaments, Tinting said: "The committee imposed a ban only on color—not styling."

Players showed up in a wide variety of colored panties last summer. Some spectators complained they distracted from the play.

The Ags' second-leading scorer and best rebounder is a 213-pounder from Hamilton. Windham stands 6-6 and has collected 160 rebounds. He has a 14.7 per game shooting average for the year and 10.8 in the SWC. Windham was leading scorer and rebounder in the conference before a leg injury sidelined him for three games back in December.

Karras, Wilson Summoned By League Commissioner

NEW YORK (AP) — The Detroit Lions' head coach, George Wilson, and All-Pro defensive tackle Alex Karras were summoned to New York Wednesday for questioning by Pete Rozelle, National Football League commissioner, following an alleged confession by the player that he had bet on games.

The Detroit News said Karras had made the admission during a taped television interview Sunday.

Asked whether he had ever bet on a game, Karras, the newspaper said, replied: "Yes, I have, but who hasn't?"

The taped show, part of an NBC newscast, has not yet appeared on the air. Tom Gallerey, NBC sports director, said it probably will be shown Thursday or Friday evening.

Lee Walker

A&M's second-leading rebounder and most accurate field shooter is a 6-7 senior from Three Rivers. Walker has 16 of 26 for 62 per cent in SWC play. He has brought 94 rebounds. Walker has averaged 11.8 points per game in conference play and 9.3 for the year.

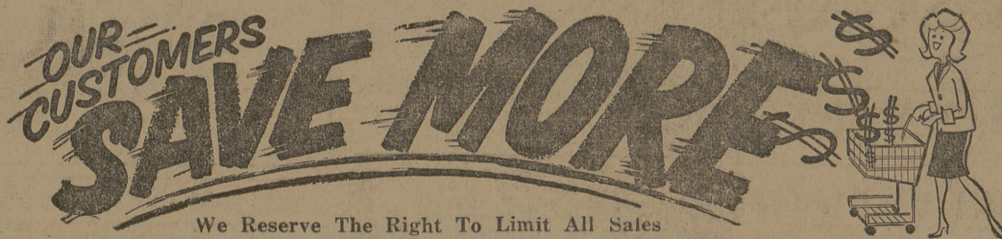
