Four men who form the first A&M College System party to Tunisia to assist in establishing a new agricultural school in that North African nation will complete a 65-day orientation program here before going overseas Mar. 15.

training program planned especially for the men and their wives starts Friday.

Ten Tunisian students will begin studies here this semester as another part of the cooperative program.

The orientation and in-service THE NEW Chott Maria Agri-

cultural School will be based on the American land-grant college concept of liberal, scientific and practical higher education. The Tunisian government seeks to relate more closely agricultural education, extension and research to the problems of Tunisian farmers.

Chief of the A&M party will Dr. Randall Stelly, associate professor of agricultural economics and sociology. During the 1950's he served as an agricultural economist with a U.S. government mission to Indo-China.

Other members of the party are Gabriel S. Uartez Jr., of Maurice, La.; Oray T. Huval of Erath, La.; and Arlan B. McSwain of Pecos. Dartez and Huval are veteran teachers of agriculture and McSwain is experienced in irrigated farming. Recently McSwain managed a large farm at Pecos.

Dr. Jack D. Gray is coordinator of foreign programs of the A&M College System, and Henry Ross will coordinate the Tunisian program.

DOMES HAS PURPOSE

'Simulated Sky' Aggie Used In Research

But what's the dome for? That is the most common question asked by Aggies (and visitors) when they view construction of the new architecture building.

For the new structure is composed of two parts; one is the main glassed-in structure and the other is a curious square building with the derby-hat shape.

Claimed to be one of the best-equipped architectural research centers in the United States, according to Theo R. Holleman, head of the Division of Architecture, the buildings are modernly constructed brick edifices which will house both the undergraduate and research centers of architecture.

In an effort to coordinate teaching, research and practice, the two buildings are being constructed side by side. In fact, there are two archways, one on the upper level and one on the ground, which connect the two.

The dome building is the research area. The dome itself is what Holleman calls a "simulated sky." Built in a half-moon shape and resting on top of the almost perfectly square building, the structure will be used to do research work in light effects upon structure models.

Around the inside of the dome will be housed 68 lighting fixtures, all horizontal effect, all into different intensities. They are turned on inside the dome will be that of a "hazy day," and professor Matthew wak. In this intensity, a large amount of daylight is observed. In the center of the dome will be an architectural model of a house or building, serving the artificial structure, researchers discover what kind of shades, overhangs and light protecting materials used most effectively in building.

The librarians will have time while on the campus to view exhibits of the Space Fiesta, Robert A. Houze, A&M librarian, said.

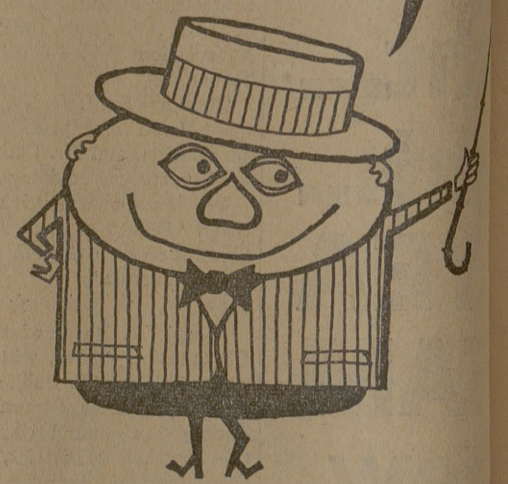
