

SHSTC To Begin Classes Tuesday

Initial class meeting for extension classes to be offered by Sam Houston State Teachers College in Bryan-College Station this spring will be held Tuesday at 6 p.m. in classrooms at the A&M Consolidated Junior High School.

Classes in History 163, U.S. history to 1865; Government 262, national and state; Education 372, psychology of adolescence; and Library Service 464, bibliography and reference, will hold their first lectures and complete all registration Tuesday.

Tuesday will be the last night for registration. The classes will meet each Tuesday night from 6-8:30 p.m. at the junior high school for 16 weeks. They carry full college credit.

Tuition for each course is \$30, and qualified Sam Houston professors will teach the courses.

TEXT BOOKS can be purchased from the professors Tuesday at lecture. Approximately 45 area residents have already registered for the courses.

Education 262, educational psychology and a sophomore level English course were requested, but there were not enough students registering for them at the registration meeting last Tuesday.

Plans are being made now by the Student Veterinary Wives Auxiliary to sponsor the extension classes again next fall.

"WE URGE anyone interested in taking a course to begin now working toward getting 15 people interested in their course," said Mrs. Judith Massey, chairman.

"Almost any course can be offered if enough people register for it. We also have plans to offer courses on two different nights so that students can carry six hours or two courses next fall, if the demand is great enough.

"In past terms there has been interest in graduate education courses, but none have materialized. We plan to renew our efforts to find 15 people interested in a graduate level course so that we can offer it here."

The primary aim of the rifle training program is firearms safety education, said Loveless.
