Aggies' Alleys

Aggie bowlers met some stiff competition in Austin Saturday and dropped to second place a game and a half behind the University of Texas in the Texas Intercollegiate Bowling Conference.

The Cadets won seven and dropped five for the day, while the Longhorns took 8½ games while losing 3¼.

IN THE FIRST match of the day, the Aggies fell three games to a hot San Antonio College team. A&M shot a good 2,725 but the Rangers rolled 2,775 on the strength of a 1,003 game.

Senior Ray Snow led the Aggies to a clean four game sweep of Sam Houston State in the second match. Snow shot 212-622 and junior Bob Korose chipped in a 204-584. The sweep knocked Sam Houston into third place three games behind Texas.

The toughest match of the day came last as the Farmers rolled a strong 2,867 to split with Texas Christian University. Jim Doan of TCU turned in a new league high game of 268 and a 641 series against the Aes.

SNOW AND KOROSE again proved the Aggies as Snow had 211-418 and Korose added a 224-614. Top man for the day was Snow, who totaled 1,793 for a 199 average in the nine games.

Korose was runner-up for the Cadets with a 1,743 nine game total.

The next meeting of the T.I.B.C. will be held in Arlington March 9.

Thursday the Aggies travel to Dallas to compete in the Region IX Association of College Unions Tournament. Region IX encompasses Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico and Louisiana and teams from colleges and universities in those states will be competing.

The bowlers will participate in team, doubles and singles events with the five top individual bowlers winning trips to Buffalo, N.Y., for the national tournament.

ROWING FOR A&M will be sophomore Ray Snow, junior Bob Korose, seniors John Tinney, Jimmie Guy, Tony Servello and Button Webb. Pairings for the doubles will be Snow-Tinney, Korose-Servello and Guy-Webb.

The tournament will be held on the Humphrey Lee Student Union Lanes at Southern Methodist University. A&M finished second to San Antonio College in last year's meet held in Austin.

Tony Servello won a place on the Region IX team and teamed up with a bowler from the University of Arkansas to win the national doubles title.

The first week of the Aggie Mid-Year Bowling Classic has ended at the MSC Lanes and Wayne Denney holds down first place with a handicapped 648 series.

ZELMAN JOSEPH shot a 642 for second place and Skipper Robinson's 637 holds down third.

The handicap singles tournament has two more weeks to run. Entry fee is \$2 and details can be secured at the desk in the bowling and games department.

Bill (Jitterbug) Henderson, for whom the Aggie Athletic dormitory is named, earned 11 varsity letters in five sports and three freshman numerals in addition to winning the intramural heavy-weight boxing and handball titles at A&M from 1939 through 1943.

The nation's three leading riders of 1962—Bill Shoemaker, Ronnie Ferraro and Bill Hartack—had 13 mounts between them one day this fall at Belmont Park. Shoemaker won the only race that day, scoring with odds-on Starett.

Cadet Riflemen Take Second In 4th Army Mail-In Match

The Fourth U.S. Army has announced results showing the A&M Rifle Team placed second in the Fourth U.S. Army Area Indoor Smallbore Championship Rifle Matches.

The competing teams represented active Army divisions, major installations, reserve units and Reserve Officer Training Corps units in a five-state area.

The Louisiana State University team ranked first in the match conducted by each team firing on its home range and mailing the results to Fourth Army.

The Aggies' high point man was James H. Elder, whose score was high enough to place him fourth on individual team honors. Elder fired 388 points out of a possible 400.

The A&M team fired 3,797 points out of a possible 4,000 in the four position, 10-man match.

A&M Range Hosts Match

A&M's ROTC rifle range will be the sight of the 90th Infantry Division's 1962-63 rifle and pistol team match competition Sunday.

Sharpshooters teams from each battle group in the divisions as well as Division Artillery, Special Troops, Division Trainees and the 215th Engineer Battalion will have their sights set on team trophies and individual honors. Awards will be given in both .22 caliber pistol and .22 caliber rifle matches.

The rifle teams will consist of five firing members and two alternates, while the pistol teams will be made up of four firing members and two alternates.

At least one-half of the firing members of each team will be "new shooters" who have not fired in this competition before.

Firing will begin at 8 a.m. under the east stands of Kyle Field. Maj. Maurice Nethery of the 90th Division Headquarters Company will be the match director.

He won the 135 pound title from Joe Brown last April 20 and in his only defense knocked out Japan's Tenu Kosaka in the fifth round at Tokyo Dec. 3.

The World Boxing Association has warned Ortiz to defend the title against Kenny Lane, the No. 1 contender from Muskegon, Mich., or face possible loss of his crown.
