

Engineering Grants Offered By JETS

Two scholarships for A&M engineering studies will be presented during the JETS (Junior Engineering Technical Society) conference on March 15. Scholarship applications must be received not later than March 1.

The JETS program involves high school extracurricular clubs to stimulate interest among junior and senior high school youth in engineering and science careers.

The Southwest Regional Conference here will include student contests in mathematics, drawing and other areas of interest, discussion groups and orientation to electronic computers. Among the speakers will be Cmdr. William R. Wakefield of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

The A&M JETS scholarship in petroleum engineering is being made available for the first time this year, J. G. McGuire of the School of Engineering announced. The scholarship carries an award of \$200 for the freshman year, renewable if the recipient qualifies scholastically, and summer employment in the petroleum industry also will be available.

McGuire said a Former Students Association JETS Scholarship award again will be made available. The award is \$250 for the freshman year and is renewable. The student may study engineering or the physical sciences.

Displays, Speaker To Highlight ITC

The first of more than 600 persons will arrive Friday on campus for the 15th annual Industrial Teacher Conference. The conference continues through Saturday.

Leading suppliers of industrial and technical educational materials will have displays in the exhibition hallway of the Mechanical Engineering Shops Building.

Featured speaker for the meeting will be Dr. T. M. Stinnett of the National Education Association.

The Texas Industrial Arts Association will meet in conjunction with the conference.

Science Fair Set Saturday At Consolidated

A&M Consolidated Junior and Senior High School students will demonstrate their scientific prowess in a science fair from 10 a.m. — 4 p.m. Saturday in the science wing of the school.

Students will explain their projects to visitors and judges. Three A&M professors, from the Department of Chemistry, Physics and Biology, will judge the entries.

All work on the science fair by the students is entirely voluntary, K. C. Morgan, general science and biology teacher at the high school said. The program is planned and coordinated by junior and senior high school science teachers as a joint project.

The winning project will then compete in the Greater Houston Science Fair March 15-17 in the Sam Houston Coliseum. The winner of the Greater Houston Science Fair will receive an all-expense-paid trip to the National Science Fair at Albuquerque, N. M.
