

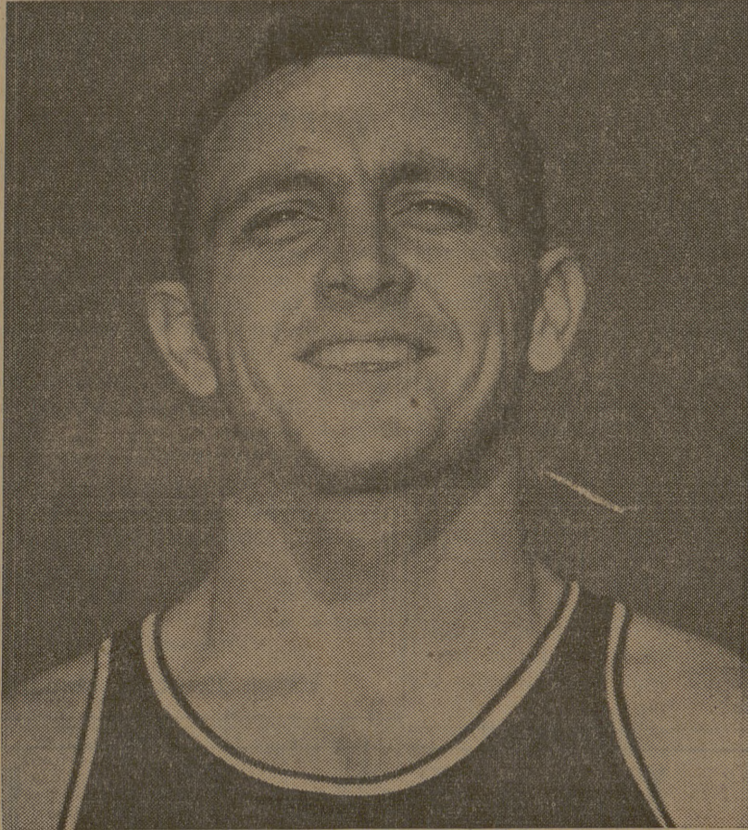
### Intramurals

Traditional antagonists, A&M and Texas, knock heads in three different contests this weekend—two in Austin and one in College Station.

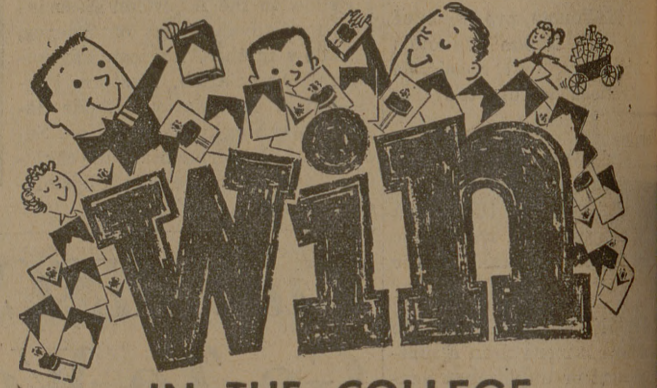
The activities begin Friday night with the Southwest Conference swimming meet at the Gregory Gym pool on the university campus.

SMU is expected to make no contest of the meet in going after its seventh straight SWC swimming title. The Aggies are picked for fourth behind Texas and Texas Tech.

Saturday afternoon, the Cadets open the conference baseball race against the Longhorns on Clark Field. This diamond is well-remembered by the Ags as they absorbed defeats here in the final two games of the '62 season. The losses cost them the championship.
