NSF Names Nine To Receive Grants

Nine A&M graduate students have been named by the National Science Foundation to receive fellowships for continued graduate studies here. Graduate Dean Wayne C. Hall was notified of the action by Foundation Director Alan T. Waterman. The four A&M students named Cooperative Graduate Fellowships for 1963-64 are among 1,300 individuals chosen as the nation. Waterman said. THE STUDENTS and their fields of study are Jimmie D. Guy, electrical engineering; Leslie R. Moore, mathematics; Jerry D. Moore, mechanical engineering; and Paul G. Naugle, physics. All from Bryan-College Station. Five students received NSF summer fellowships as Teaching Assistants. They are Hollis C. Adams, physics; Andrew J. Edmondson, mechanical engineering;

Walter L. Green, electrical engineering; Frank C. Schmalstieg, chemistry; and Donald R. Wiff, physics. All but Schmalstieg, who calls Sinton his home, list local addresses. "The National Science Graduate Fellowships," Hall said, "are of inestimable value in our drive towards excellence in graduate instruction and research." The national competition on a merit basis for these fellowships brings distinction to A&M and the awardees, he added. THE FOUR students named as Cooperative Graduate Fellows may start tenure of their fellowships between June 1 and early September. Their basic stipend is \$200 monthly up to 12 months. The other five fellowships are designed to allow teaching assistants to study full time during the summer.

ience he taught architecture at Oklahoma State University from 1948 - 1952 with a year (1949 - 1950) spent in graduate work at Harvard University and teaching in the Volunteer Evening Design Teaching Service of the Boston Architectural Center. Romieniec received B. S. and M. S. degrees in architecture from the University of Illinois in 1947 and 1948, respectively, and the M. A. degree from Harvard in 1950 after study under Prof. Walter Gropius. He is a member of the American Institute of Architects and his professional registrations include the states of Illinois, Oklahoma, Texas, and New York. In professional practice, Romieniec has worked with the small Home Research Council of the University of Illinois; Phil Wilbur, Architect, Stillwater, Oklahoma; Coston - Frankfurt - Short, Architects & Engineers, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; Caudill, Rowlett & Scott, Architects, Houston, Texas; and for his own firm—Edward J. Romieniec & Associates, New York, N. Y. While teaching at A&M, Romieniec was coordinator of design. He has traveled and studied extensively in the United States and abroad.
