

## Horse Show Gives \$4700 In Awards

approximately \$4700 in cash, ribbons and trophies will be awarded Saturday to winners in the 21st annual Quarter Horse Show held at the college arena at 4 p.m.

To be eligible for the show, entries must be registered with American Quarter Horse Association with members of National Quarter Horse Breeders Association also being eligible. Halts, foals, yearlings and two-year-olds listed in the Appendix are eligible. Stallions and mares over three years of age or over must have a registration number. Geldings need Appendix Registration.

The show will feature a NCHA championship cutting horse contest, which will have a \$100 purse added.

**THERE WILL BE** a high point trophy awarded to the best all-around horse of the show. To be eligible, a horse must show in halter and at least three of the registered performance classes, said Ken Dorris, show chairman.

The 48-minute Aggie Rodeo Club will sponsor the show which is approved by the AQHA and the National Cutting Horse Association.

Free stalls will be provided for exhibitors at the show grounds and the auction barn on a "first come, first served" basis, according to Dorris.

The horse show will be held in the new rodeo arena. If the weather is bad, the livestock pavilion will be available.

**REGISTRATION PERFORMANCE** classes will include junior western pleasure, senior western pleasure, junior reining, senior reining, junior barrel race, senior barrel race, pole bending, roping contest, junior cutting horse and senior cutting horse.
