Dutch Geologist Sets 5 Lectures

A Dutch professor of geology will give five lectures here next week.

Dr. L. U. de Sitter is professor of structural and applied geology at Leiden University.

His profession has taken him to various parts of the world, and he is visiting the campus as one of the participants in the Visiting

International Scientist Program of the American Geological Institute.

Persons interested in the earth sciences have been invited to attend the lectures.

"GEOLOGIC STRUCTURE of the Pyrenees" is de Sitter's topic for his first lecture. It is scheduled at 10 a.m. Monday in Room 211 of the Petroleum Engineering Building. All of the lectures will be given in that room.

The topic of the second lecture, scheduled at 10 a.m. Tuesday, is "Geologic Structure of the Cantabric Mountains," and at the same hour Wednesday he will lecture on "Recumbent Folds."

de Sitter will lecture on "Concentric and Cleavage Folding," at 3 p.m. and on "Geology and Geophysics" at 7:30 p.m. Thursday.

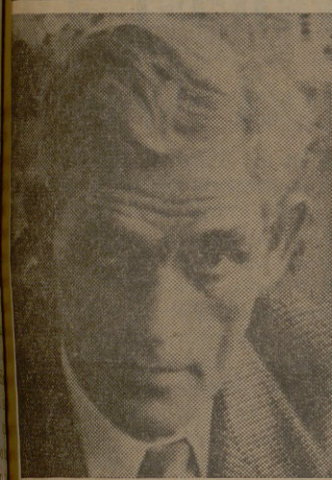
THE DUTCH geologist attended primary and secondary schools in Leiden, where his father was a professor of astronomy, and started his geological studies in Zurich in 1949.

Two Aero Students Present Papers At Ft. Worth Meeting

Two Department of Aerospace Engineering students are contestants in the North Texas Section of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics 11th annual Student Paper Competition Thursday-Saturday at Fort Worth.

The students and titles of their papers are Gerald J. Carey of Brooklyn, N. Y., "An Analysis of Plastic Torsion in Circular Cross Section with Eccentric Holes," and Donald T. Hunter of Houston, "Effect of Thermal Stresses on the Mechanical Properties of Adhesives."

CAREY is a graduate student, and Hunter a senior. They delivered their papers Thursday.

Charles A. Rodenberger, associate professor of aerospace engineering, said seven other students in the department also are attending the sessions as observers.

They are Lloyd Smithley of Ro-

senberg, Robert E. Harvey of Lubbock, Winton B. Zimmerman of San Antonio, Maj. James F. Sullivan of Bryan, W. R. Woodard of Joshua, Michael E. Buffo of San Benito and Jerry Bob Hattox of Abilene.

RODENBERGER said the event is actively supported by the major aerospace companies in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, and one of its purposes is to create closer industry-faculty-student relations.

He said one of the students, Maj. Sullivan, will discuss the definition of an aerospace engineer at an industry-faculty social at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Rodenberger said Carey and Hunter are winners of a previous paper contest held at A&M, entitling them to compete in the regional event. If they win, their papers will be submitted and judged on a national basis.

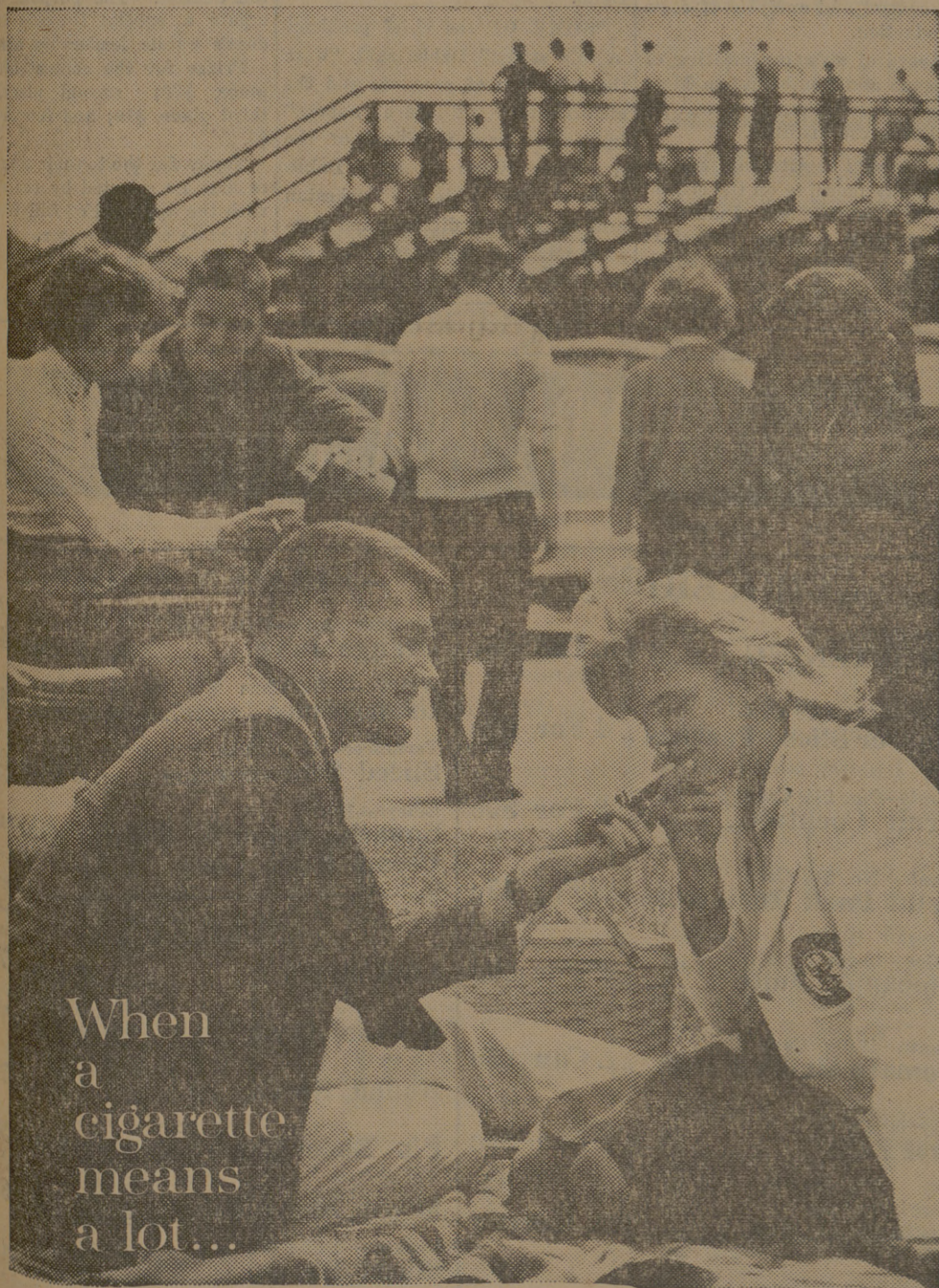
