Palmer Shoots Record Title in Texas Open

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Arnold Palmer leads a field of 164 into the \$30,000 Texas Open Thursday on winning it for the fourth year in a row so he can make history. The tournament that has been known as the Palmer Benefactor and to further emphasize it, tournament officials have dedicated this year's event to him. They even gave him a banquet to show their appreciation for coming here each year to pick up the trophy.

Palmer wins this time, and of course, favored to do so, will set a record-no player has won one PGA tournament in four so many times in succession. Palmer will be the only one of the Big Three to play here. Ben Nicklaus, the year's leading money winner with \$39,715, and Gary Player, the runner-up with \$30,002, are passing up the 36th Texas Open. That doesn't mean there isn't a crack field. Thirteen of the top 25 money-winners and 15 who have won tournaments are on the tour this year will start in the opening 18 holes. Palmer won the tournament last year with 273 but the course has been toughened. It will measure 7,150 yards and have a par 35-36.

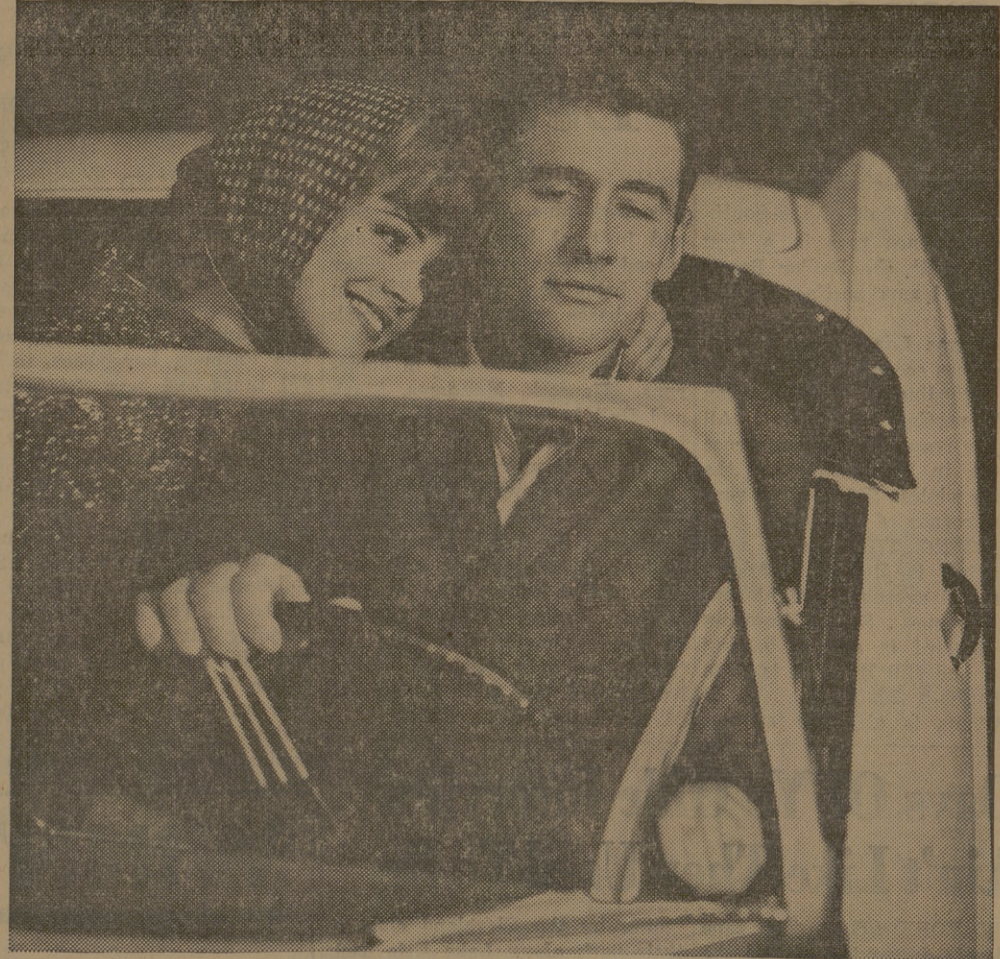

Following a two-game series with the Rice Owls this weekend, A&M starts the stretch run with a game against the Horned Frogs Tuesday. Then Baylor hosts the Ags in a pair May 3 and 4 and the finish comes against the Longhorns in Kyle Field, May 10 and 11.

We see no reason why the stands of Kyle Field cannot be just as full for the TCU tilt Tuesday as they always are for the Texas games.

Let's see standing room only for the remaining home games and a good representation at the road games.
