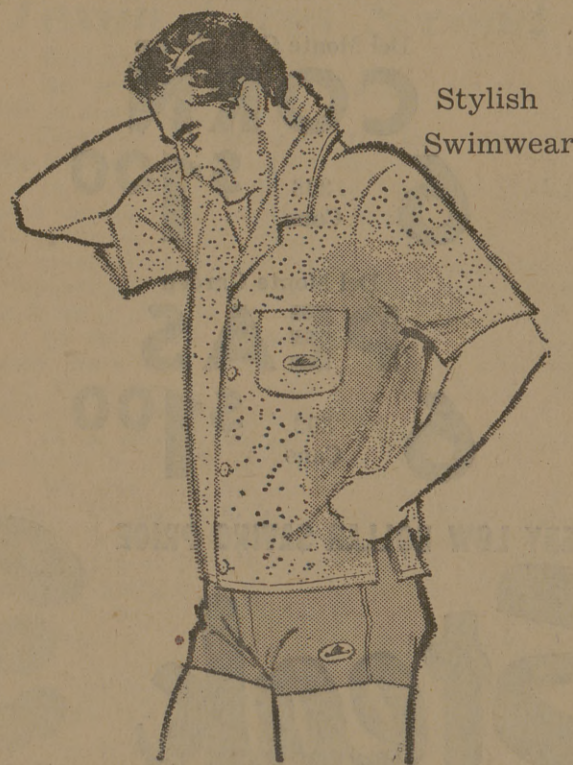

# Friday Concert Set For Singing Cadets

The annual concert of the A&M Singing Cadets will be presented at 8 p.m. Friday in Guion Hall, Bob Boone, director, has announced.

The 60-voice chorus will be accompanied by Mrs. June Bump Biering, former music director for radio station WOAI in San Antonio.

THE FINAL presentation of the year will be made at the A&M Federation of Mother's Club meeting May 11.

This year's concert theme is "It's Music for You," featuring musical selections of spiritual, classical, popular, patriotic and comical nature, according to Boone, who is completing his third year as director.

Following the traditional opening with "The Spirit," the Cadets will present "My Lady Walks in Loveliness" and "Calm As the Night," followed by "It's Me, O Lord." Lewis King of Bryan is the featured soloist with the spiritual.

The first of two quartets will then present a selection from Riggoletto Berdi, done completely in lighter touch fashion.

From there they will fly to Africa, where Bleau will be assigned to an agricultural project in Northern Rhodesia and Ray will take part in a school construction and teaching project in Uganda. "Operation Crossroads" for the past five years has been the pilot project for the Peace Corps.



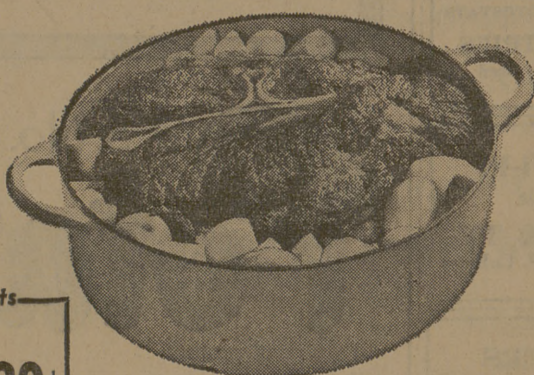

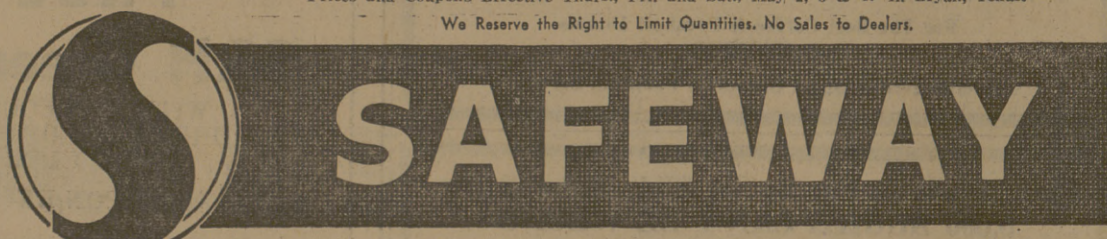
