

36,000 In Aid Given To College

Two matching grants totaling more than \$36,000 for additional scientific instructional equipment have been received from the National Science Foundation, President Earl Rudder announced Thursday.

A \$22,370 grant is for a electrical Department of Engineering program directed by Dr. Glen D. Barkham.

Also announced was a \$13,770 grant for a mechanical engineering program directed by Dr. Clifford Simmang.

A&M will match the NSF grants purchasing equipment to be used for laboratory and demonstration purposes at the undergraduate level.

These two grants bring the total to five announced for A&M since the inception of the program.

P. L. Downs, Jr., A&M's official greeter, announced Wednesday that 51,497 visitors have been on campus during the last 11 months.

The guests attended short courses, conferences, class reunions and other scheduled meetings.

A&M has had 830,466 visitors on campus during a 13 year, 11 month period, Downs pointed out.

The Division of Business Administration and the Student Marketing Society, in conjunction with the Houston Sales Executives Club will sponsor the 14th annual Sales Clinic on Tuesday in Room 202, Francis Hall.

Featuring prominent business executives from throughout the state, the clinic will host four guest speakers to lecture on transportation, vending machine merchandising, advertising and industrial distribution. Also, a four man panel will discuss salesmanship.

Ike Jacobs '41, a Dallas builder will be the featured guest speaker at a banquet Tuesday evening.

Two scholarships will be presented during the Clinic.

The closing session Friday will feature talks and demonstrations on "Teaching Nutrition."
