THREE OF the A&M foursome broke par in relegating Baylor to a second place finish. Mike Higgins was the leader with a 68 over the 6,875-yard, par 70 layout. Higgins trounced Jim Grant 7 and 5.

Harry Hoskins and Ralph Johnston turned in winning their matches against Tom Langston 3 and 2 and Joe Pat Rickett 1-up.

The half-point was garnered when team captain Eugene Byrd tied with Baylor's Randy Meeks.
