A two-year

letterman, Singley hit .143 last year and is currently hitting

at a .226 clip. Hall, from Fort Worth, was switched to leftfield midway through the campaign after playing centerfield the two previous years. He is a two-year letterman who has gained a reputation throughout the conference for his fine arm and wide range in the center spread. Hall slumped to a .165 batting average last year after hitting .365 his sophomore year. He has come on strong recently and is is the second leading hitter on the club with a .303 average.
