

Cadet Tennis Men In Waco For SWC Championships

WACO (AP) — Fritz Schunck and Jim Parker of Rice, Daryl Allison of Texas Tech, and Richard Baker of A & M kept their seeding and hopes alive Thursday as they reached the semi-finals

of the Southwest Conference tennis championships.

Schunck defeated Paul Christian of TCU 6-3, 6-1, and Darrell Willerson of Texas 6-0, 7-5. Parker defeated Jim Robison of Baylor 1-6, 6-2, 6-2, and Pete Hennessey of Texas 6-2, 6-1.

Allison defeated Mike Lawless of Texas and Doug Sassman of A & M 4-6, 6-4, 6-2. Barker defeated Mike Amis of SMU 6-4, 6-1 and Robert Peterson of Texas Tech 6-2, 6-8, 6-2.

Schunck, Parker, Allison and Barker are seeded one through four respectively.

In the doubles, Baylor's Jimmy Robison and Ed Williams upset No. 2 seeded Paul Christian and Earl Van Zandt of TCU 6-3, 6-4.

No. 1 seeded Schunck and Parker of Rice defeated John Cook and Roy Murtishaw of Arkansas 6-0, 6-1.

No. 3 seeded Barker and Ricky Williams of A & M defeated Beau Sutherland and Greer Kothman of Texas Tech 6-4, 6-2.

No. 4 seeded Allison and Robert Peterson of Tech defeated Mike Lawless and Darrell Willerson of Texas 6-2, 6-4.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE QUESTION OF REZONING A TRACT OF LAND 427 X 131 IN THE GORZYCKI ADDITION WHICH IS BOUNDED ON THE NORTH, WEST AND SOUTHWEST SIDES BY A & M COLLEGE PROPERTY AND ON THE NORTHEAST SIDE BY MEADOWLAND STREET FROM DISTRICT NO. 2, SECOND DWELLING HOUSE DISTRICT TO DISTRICT NO. 8, APARTMENT HOUSE DISTRICT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of College Station, Texas:

WHEREAS, the City Zoning Commission after consideration has recommended the rezoning of certain areas of land herein-after fully described; now therefore,

It is hereby ordered that a public hearing shall be held in the City Hall at 7:30 p. m. on May 27, 1963 on the question of rezoning areas within the city limits as follows:

1. A tract of land beginning at the west corner, said corner abutting property owned by A. & M. College, thence southeast along said A. & M. College property a distance of 427 feet, thence northeast a distance of 131 feet to a center line of Meadowland Street, thence northwest a distance of 427 feet; thence southwest a distance of 131 feet along A. & M. College property to point of beginning.

Notice of said hearing shall be published in the official city newspaper at least fifteen days prior to said date of said public hearing.

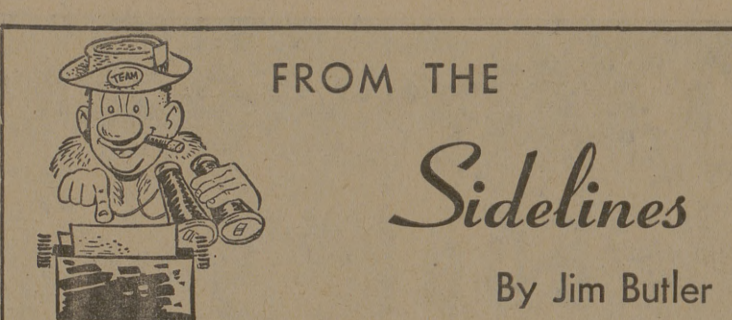

Regalia For The May Commencement
All students who are candidates for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy are required to order hoods as well as the doctor's cap and gown. The hoods are to be left at the Registrar's Office no later than 1:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 21 (this will be accomplished by a representative of the College Exchange Store). The Ph.D. hoods will not be worn in the procession since all such candidates will be hooded on the stage as a part of the ceremonies. Candidates for the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine will wear the doctor's cap, gown and hood appropriate to this degree. Candidates for the Master's Degree will wear the Master's cap and gown. All civilian students who are candidates for the Bachelor's Degree will wear the bachelor's cap and gown. ROTC students who are candidates for the Bachelor's Degree will wear the Class "A" cadet uniform in lieu of academic regalia. Senior hoods are optional with the uniform. Rental of caps and gowns may be arranged with the Exchange Store. Orders may be placed between 8:00 a.m., Monday, May 6 and 12:00 noon Saturday, May 18. The rental is as follows: Doctor's cap and gown \$5.25, Master's cap and gown \$4.75, Bachelor's cap and gown \$4.25. Hood rental is the same as that for cap and gown. Five seniors will be playing or watching their last baseball game in an Aggie uniform when the Texas Longhorns come to town for a two-game series this weekend.

They are pitchers Kenny Floyd and Ed Singley, catcher Bill Puckett, shortstop Jack Singley and leftfielder Ray Hall. Floyd transferred to A&M from Tarleton State College last year, winning one and losing none.

Ed Singley, twin brother of Jack, is a two-year letterman from Oklahoma City. He had a 5-1 record for Coach Tom Chandler last year and pitched in 10 games while posting a 4-1 slate this season.

Puckett, another two-year letterman, has been A&M's regular catcher for the past three seasons. He is from Oklahoma City also and caught for Singley in high school. Puckett hit .200 for the Aggies last year and was hitting .226 through 23 games this season.

Jack Singley has performed mainly as utility infielder this season playing third base and shortstop. A two-year letterman, Singley hit .143 last year and is currently hitting at a .226 clip.

Hall, from Fort Worth, was switched to leftfield midway through the campaign after playing centerfield the two previous years. He is a two-year letterman who has gained a reputation throughout the conference for his fine arm and wide range in the center spread. Hall slumped to a .165 batting average last year after hitting .365 his sophomore year. He has come on strong recently and is the second leading hitter on the club with a .303 average.

These five have done an outstanding job for A&M and a full grandstand Saturday afternoon would show them how much they are appreciated.

The Southwest Conference baseball season comes to a close for Coach Tom Chandler's Aggies this weekend as they play host to the Texas Longhorns in a two-game series in Kyle Field.

The Cadets take an 8-5 conference record and a 14-9 season slate into Friday's game. The Steers are riding an 11 game winning streak and stand atop the SWC with a 9-2 record.

Game time Friday is 3 p.m. while the Saturday tilt is slated for 2 p.m.

Other conference action includes Texas Christian at Rice for a game series.
