## New Speed Limit, But Don't Try It!

AUSTIN (AP) — Don't drive home from work today at 70 miles an hour and expect the highway patrolman to be cordial and understanding.

The governor signed the 70-mile-an-hour speed limit bill Monday, but —

And here are several "buts" and "ifs" before the 70 mph signs appear on Texas highways.

IN THE FIRST place, the bill is not effective until 90 days after the legislature ends. That will be Aug. 22 or Aug. 25, depending if adjournment is May 24 or 27. Until then the speed limit on all state highways is still 60 in the daytime, 55 at night.

In the second place, the bill di-

rects the State Highway Department to study traffic and highway conditions and to post the 70 miles per hour maximum for passenger cars only on those highways capable of handling the extra speed safely. The night limit for cars would be 60. Trucks are limited to 60 and 55.

"JUST TO prejudice the situation, it appears almost all four-lane, divided highways will get the new 70 miles per hour rating and so will many long stretches of two-lane highways with paved shoulders," said state highway engineer D. C. Greer.

"The bill suits us fine. We think it is right. It sets a realistic pattern for traffic control."

Greer's department will make the traffic surveys and turn over its recommendations to the State Highway Commission, which in turn will designate sections of highways to carry the speed maximum.

THE BILL also gives the Highway Commission authority to post minimum speed limits on certain sections where slow moving traffic might endanger faster traveling vehicles.
