The show was scheduled so that proceeds can be used to help pay hospitalization expenses recently incurred by the David G. Woodcock family.

Shortly after the birth of their first child, Mrs. Woodcock was

rushed to Houston in April for a major brain operation.

Woodcock is a Fulbright professor and resident of Manchester, England who joined the Division of Architecture faculty in September.

"The great expense of surgery, plus the prolonged treatment, caused great hardship on our guests from England," Graham Horsley,

assistant professor of architecture said.

Included in the benefit show will be two short scenes from "The Imaginary Invalid," a play satirizing doctors and centered around an elderly hypochondriac. One of the works of 17th Century French playwright and actor Moliere, "The Imaginary Invalid" was presented earlier this spring.

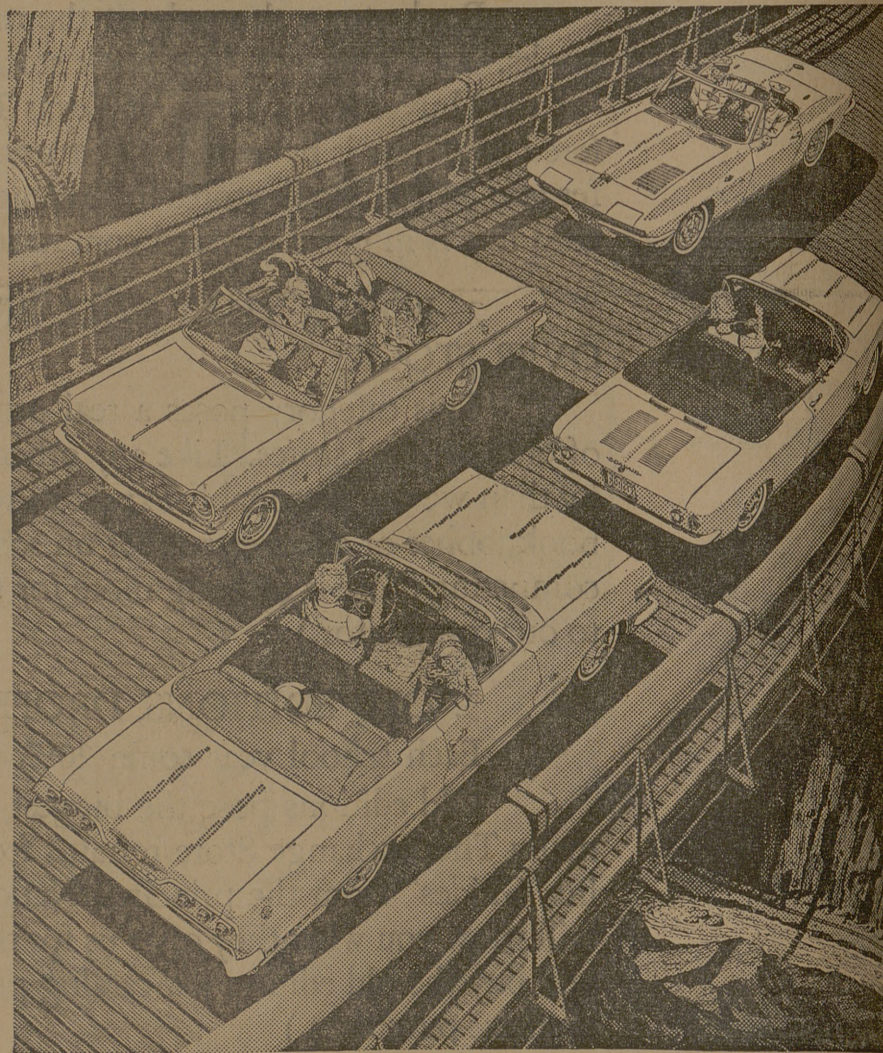
