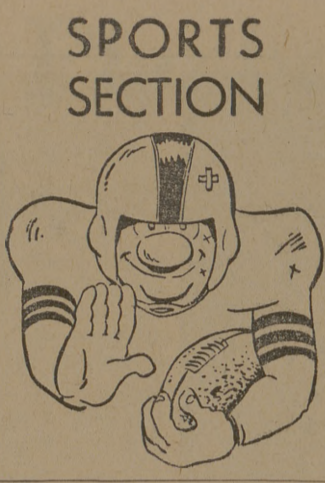


# Yankees May Have Infield Liked To Old Chicago Cubs

NEW YORK (AP) — Maybe Ralph Houk is right. Maybe the New York Yankees have a "five-million-dollar infield" as Manager Houk proclaims.  
Five million or 50 million, the Yankee foursome of Cleve Boyer, Tony Kubek, Bobby Richardson and Joe Pepitone can never hope to match in glory and fame the fabled infield of the Chicago Cubs of nearly half a century ago.

FEW, IF any today can identify the third baseman, Harry Steinfeldt, of that Cub infield but hardly anyone hasn't heard of the famed double play combination of Tinker-to-Evers-to-Chance.  
And therein lies a great hoop a gigantic piece of propaganda that transformed an ordinary double play combination into a legendary one.  
THE TRUTH is the double play was not perpetrated by this trio

any more than by less famous contemporaries. It only seems that way.  
In the five years from 1907 through 1910, the trio accounted for no more than 54 double plays in 770 games.  
By way of comparison, Pittsburgh's double play combination of second baseman Bill Mazeroski and shortstop Dick Groat collaborated in 126 double plays last year.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Pat Richter, Wisconsin's All-American end, signed a one-year contract Wednesday with the Washington Redskins of the National Football League.

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — The University of Kentucky announced Wednesday it has lowered the racial barriers and will open its athletic program to persons of all races - thus becoming the first school in the Southwestern Conference to take such action.  
The university's athletics board, in a terse statement said its athletic team immediately "will be open to any student regardless of race."

## Roberts, Collins Pace Aggies In Gulf Coast Track And Field

Fieldman John (Doughboy) Collins and weightman Danny Roberts paced a delegation of Aggie track and field athletes to a 4:07.9 mile for the best in the Gulf Coast Track and Field Federation Meet in Houston.  
Collins placed third in the triple jump, high jump and broad jump. The Liberty sophomore's best leap in the triple jump, his first attempt in that event, was 46-4. He cleared the high bar at 6-4 but Collin Ridgeway of Lamar Tech won the event with 6-8¾. In the broad jump, Collins' best effort was 23-4½, which was one half inch off second place. In that event, Bill Miller of McMurry Track Club contributed one of the best efforts of the meet with a jump of 25-8¼.  
Danny Roberts took a second

place in the shot put with a throw of 56-2½ behind Jim Lamm Baylor who tossed the shot 56-5½. The big man from land also placed second in the discus with 166-3.  
Jerry Anderson qualified in the finals of the 400-yard dash but pulled up lame.  
The meet also held some outstanding performances in the finals of the 400-yard dash. Tech's James McLatchie won a 4:07.9 mile for the best in that event in Texas this year. Mer Aggie gridders and runner David Bonds turned in a time of 53 seconds flat in the yard hurdles and Jamie Bond and Sue Schexmeyer set a new in the girls 100-yard dash with 1:10.
