

TWELVE TRAINING COURSES OFFERED

Annual Firemen's School To Convene Here July 21

Dates for the 34th annual Texas Fireman's Training School at A&M have been announced by Henry D. Smith, chief of the engineering extension firemen training program.

The school will be held July 21-26. More than 250 instructors have been made available by various state and federal agencies, indus-

try, military services and municipalities.

Smith expects about the same enrollment as last year, 1,700 firemen from 425 cities and 20 states.

This summer's school will include instruction in basic and advanced fire fighting techniques. Fire marshals will attend classes during the same period.

Thousands of dollars worth of the latest equipment will be displayed by numerous manufacturers, Smith mentioned. Other equipment and supplies are loaned or donated by industry for the week-long school.

Towns sending firemen to the school receive up to five per cent credit for participation. They are also required to maintain and support an acceptable fire department, Smith said.

Twelve separate 30-hour training courses will be offered. Completion of the program with a grade of 70 or better will result in a certificate for the department and the fireman.

The 1,700 firemen will be housed in cadet dormitories and eat in college dining facilities.

Journalism Professor Authors Mexican Research Monograph

Dr. John C. Merrill, associate professor of journalism, is the author of a monograph published by the School of Inter-American Studies of the University of Florida.

"Gringo—The American As Seen by Mexican Journalists" is largely an outgrowth of his doctoral dissertation done at the State University of Iowa in 1962.

The monograph includes results of a detailed study of the image of the United States projected in the Mexican press and attitudes of Mexican journalists toward this nation.

Merrill concluded the Mexican

journalists had an "unfavorable and antagonistic opinions" in the final year of the Eisenhower administration.

In a followup mentioned in the monograph, Merrill said additional questionnaires were mailed to 65 journalists to see of the image had undergone any change.

"The Mexican journalists apparently feel that President Kennedy has tried, and is trying, to better United States-Mexican relations," the professor said.

"The hard-core antagonistic feelings, however, have carried forward virtually unchanged into the middle of 1962," he added.

British Consul To Address Pressmen
