

Cochran, Furr To Assist In NSF Proposal Choices

Dr. Robert G. Cochran, head of the Department of Nuclear Engineering, and Dr. Howard L. Furr, professor of civil engineering, will be in Washington, D.C. Wednesday and Thursday to help evaluate proposals submitted by science and mathematics teachers for advanced training through the National Science Foundation funds.

Through the NSF, teachers of science and math are provided supplementary subject-matter training at many colleges and universities in the United States.

The two men will be panel members for 1964 Summer Institutes for College Teachers. Approximately 175 proposals will be considered. For 1963, a total of 75 were granted in science, math and technical subjects areas.

In issuing the invitations, the NSF said the problems "inherent in the task of choosing wisely those institutes which are most meritorious are by no means simple. We need the help of competent people in arriving at the required decisions."

Cochran has headed the nuclear engineering department here since 1959, when the department went into operation. He came to A&M from Penn State.

Presbyterians Install Pastor Sunday Night

The Rev. H. Bruce Fisher was installed as pastor of the A&M Presbyterian church during a service Sunday night. The new pastor came from a Port Arthur pastorate.

A reception for Fisher, who assumed the pastorate here July 1, was held following the service.

Three teaching elders or ministers and three duling elders (laymen), named by the Presbytery of Brazos, formed the commission that installed the new minister.

The Rev. Richard Thomas, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Bryan, presided at the installation and propounded the constitutional questions.

John Beckham, a ruling elder of the First Church, and Dr. Luther Jones and Robert Houze, elders of the A&M Church, were members of the commission.

Dairy Science Head Named Delegate To World Meeting

Dr. I. W. Rupel, head of the Department of Dairy Science, has been named a delegate to the World Conference on Animal Production in Rome, Italy, Sept. 2-7. The announcement was made by the American Dairy Science Association meeting at Purdue University. Rupel is immediate past president of the dairy association.

Dr. and Mrs. Rupel will leave Aug. 10 enroute to the international meeting. They will tour parts of Scotland, Norway and Switzerland and return to College Station Sept. 12.

The conference is sponsored by European Association for Animal Production, the American Society of Animal Science and the American Dairy Science Association. It will be held in conjunction with

the "Freedom from Hunger Campaign." Rupel said a three-day tour of agricultural points in Southern Italy will follow the conference.

He plans to participate in a special session on "Meat Production by Dairy Cattle."

"More than 33 per cent of red meat consumed in the United States comes from dairy animals," Rupel said. "Dairy scientists have no small stake in meat production activities. The proportion is even greater in European countries, where dairy and dual-purpose breeds dominate the cattle production."

California Scientist To Lecture Monday

Donald E. Rawson of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory at the University of California will lecture at 8 p. m. Monday.

The lecture in Room 113 of the Biological Sciences Building is scheduled for National Science Foundation Summer Institute participants, faculty, staff and graduate students. The public also is invited to hear Rawson discuss the "GNOME Project."

Rawson joined the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory in Livermore, Calif., in September, 1958. His work has been associated with "Plowshare," first in the Chemistry Division until 1961. He is now group leader of the Earth Sciences Section for Plowshare.

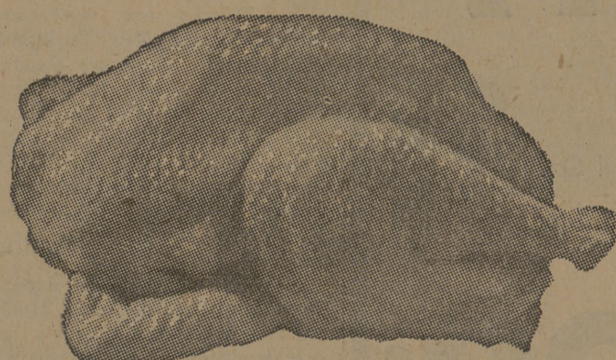
