## NO REST THIS SUMMER Ag Coaches Lecture In Houston

Theoretically, the long, hot summer is a time when college coaches relax.

The recruiting crop has been laid by and it's time for fishing, swimming and golf. Some even take vacations.

But, for A&M track coach Charles Thomas and baseball mentor Tom Chandler such has not been the case this summer.

They are scheduled to give four one-hour lectures each on their respective sports during the Texas High School Coaches Association's school in Houston, Aug. 5-9. The preparations have left the two Aggie coaches with a soreness unfamiliar to most athletes—writer's cramp.

THE MEN HAD TO write the lectures in their entirety for distribution at the school. This they did, painstakingly, in longhand, and each required much rewriting before final drafts were completed. "There are 14 different events that high school boys participate

in at the state meet and training and techniques are different in each," Thomas explained. "It isn't easy to cover 'em all in four lectures."

Thomas' four lectures include (1) distance running, (2) field events, (3) sprints and 440-yard relay and (4) 440-yard dash, mile relay and hurdle events.

"I don't mind giving lectures," he said, "except for the fact that many of my listeners will be men who were coaching when I was running high school track. A lot of 'em know more about the sport than I."

CHANDLER, a graduate of the Texas high school coaching ranks, has been tutoring A&M baseballers for the past five seasons.

"Hitting is one of the things I'll stress during the lectures," the 38-year-old coach said. "When I was handling the Alpine Cowboys (a strong semi-pro club) during the summers of 1952-58, Hall-of-

Famer Paul Waner used to bat for a couple of weeks batting instructions. But I teach about batting from him."

That Chandler teaches evidenced by the way he has slugged the home-run cent years. They have 100 homers during the seasons.

Born in Greenville, grew up in Dallas and graduated from Adamson High, an all-Southwest Conference-first baseman two years later and Bruin team captain seasons. He coached High from 1952-53, then state finals twice, in '54.

THOMAS, who is in his sixth season as head coach at A&M, had played an high school and college yard dash star. During years of competition he lost races in Texas, both at the Olympics.
