The nomination for the award pointed out that Mrs. House possesses exceptional skill and ability exceeding the requirements of the regular duties and responsibilities of her position. It also noted that "her courteous, friendly, yet dignified manner" has contributed to the maintenance of cordial relationships between the Cotton Insects Research Laboratory and other agencies.

## Speech By Transportation Institute Official Published

A speech made by John P. Doyle of the Texas Transportation Institute at A&M has been published in the current issue of the National Defense Transportation Journal.

His talk was presented at the National Defense Transportation Day observance in San Antonio. In his address, the retired major general warned "unnecessary transportation costs increase the cost of living and weaken our competitive position in world markets—including our own."

He added that transportation is consuming an "unnecessarily large share of our national wealth, and, in the process, creating a threat to our security both by helping undermine our economic structure and by weakening our common carriers which from the first line of defense transportation."

"National security," he continued, "is not limited to a shoot-

ing defense against an armed aggressor. Our way of life can be destroyed in other ways."

All modes of transportation, with the possible exception of pipelines

and transmission lines, are contributing to this economic waste, the speaker added.

Doyle fills the McDonald Chair of Transportation at A&M.

## Benjamin Evans Resigns Post Here

Benjamin H. Evans, coordinator of architectural research at A&M, has resigned to become head of research for the American Institute of Architects in Washington, D. C.

Evans will terminate 11 years of teaching and research at A&M Thursday. He joined the faculty in 1952 and became coordinator of research in 1958. No replacement has been named.

He received both bachelor's and master's degrees in architecture from A&M.

In his new position, Evans will work directly with the AIA Committee on Research for Architecture to determine and implement research programs and to develop

and disseminate research information.

At A&M, Evans has done fundamental research regarding the effects of architectural shapes on natural lighting, natural ventilation, sound and other environmental factors.

He helped establish an architectural model testing laboratory and directed investigations into the shell concrete construction within forms and into the use of limited shelters for physical education.

Evans is the author of numerous publications on research in architecture. A member of several organizations, he is secretary at past president of the Brazos Chapter of AIA.
