

# Zoologist's Trip To Include National Ecologists' Meeting

Dr. Lawrence S. Dillon of the Department of Biology leaves today for a trip which includes attendance and presenting a paper at a national meeting.

He will present a paper titled "Changes in World Temperature Patterns" to the Ecological Society of America on Aug. 27. The meeting is part of the American Institute of Biological Sciences meeting Aug. 27 through Sept. 1 on the University of Massachusetts campus.

Dr. J. R. Couch of the Department of Poultry Science is participating in the International Congress on Nutrition Friday through Aug. 16 at Edinburgh, Scotland.

He will present a paper titled "Effect of High and Low Levels of Dietary Fat on the Fatty Acid Composition in Egg Yolk."

After the Scotland meeting, Couch will travel to Nottingham, England, to confer with staff members of the University of Nottingham and the University of Reading at Reading.

William L. Hoffman, who received the M.S. degree in physics here in 1956 and most recently has taught at Arlington State College, will join the A&M faculty in September.

Edmonson said workshop emphasis will be focused on effective teaching and student learning. Standards of excellence will be set from several points of view. Subject areas, he said, will include student advisory and counseling programs, and classroom responsibilities.

Professor Lee J. Martin will be at Army Command and General College, Fort Leavenworth, Monday studying the Army's use of overhead projectors and teaching aids.

Martin, as chairman of the Human English committee, has several trips recently gaining information and ideas for use in the program at A&M.

Martin plans to return here today.

Associate Professor Dr. Earl S. Webb and Assistant Professor Bill Erick of the Department of Agricultural Education will participate in the Southern Regional Research Conference in Agricultural Education this week at Oklahoma State University.

Theme of the 12th annual meeting is "Designing Research in Agricultural Education." A major activity will be reviews by committees of recently completed studies and proposed research projects.

Webb will preside over the second general session and serve as chairman for the Inservice Training Committee. He also will present preliminary data of a study he is completing, "A Study to Identify the Nature of the Major Professional Difficulties Encountered by Teachers of Vocational Agriculture in Texas."

Dr. Alvin A. Price, dean of the A&M School of Veterinary Medicine, will address the Beaumont Veterinary Medical Association Aug. 9.

The educator will discuss "Developments in Veterinary Medicine."

T. D. Tanksley, of the Department of Animal Husbandry, has been selected to judge the Open division swine classes at the 1963 California State Fair & Exposition, Aug. 28-Sept. 9.

Miss Annabeth Swanzy, a native of Port Arthur and most recently a member of the Tarleton State College faculty, will join the Department of English effective Sept. 1.

# Forest Geneticist From Here To Attend Meeting In Sweden

Dr. J. P. van Buijtenen, silviculturist for the Texas Forest Experiment Station, will participate in a forest genetics meeting in Stockholm, Sweden, August 19-31.

Originally from the Netherlands, van Buijtenen received his B.S. degree in forestry at Landbouwhogeschool. He later received his Master of Science degree from the University of California and his doctorate in genetics from A&M. He has been in charge of the Texas Cooperative Forest Tree Improvement program since 1961.

He is a member of Sigma Xi; Technical Association of the Pulp and Paper Industry; American Association for the Advancement of Science; and American Institute of Biological Sciences.

van Buijtenen will present a paper, "Inheritance of Properties in Pinus taeda and Their Relation to Growth." Several tours will be conducted in connection with the meeting. Following the meeting, van Buijtenen will tour southern Sweden, visiting forest research organizations.

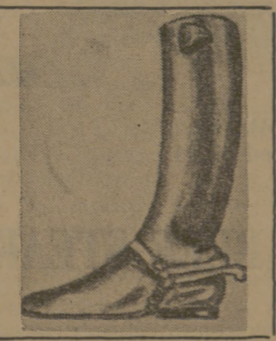
