The ace halfback also starred in basketball.

Following graduation he served at an Indiana high school before returning to Purdue in 1952 as a freshman assistant.

From there he went to two other high schools before joining Foldberg at Wichita in 1960.

He is a combat veteran of World War II and was awarded a battle star in Okinawa.

* * * The local dean of the staff, Smith came to A&M in 1954 after winning two state titles and compiling a 54-27-2 record at Southern Arkansas State College.


