

# A&M Consolidated Prepares For Season Opener Friday

Coach Edsel Jones has no where to go but up with his A&M Consolidated Tigers this season.

Picked to finish last in District 19-AA, Consolidated returns only six lettermen and two seniors. The Tigers have a light squad with no member weighing over 190 pounds and have a serious depth problem.

The lettermen are: Darrell Gossett, 185, Jr.; J. Pewthers, 170, Sr.; Carl Gough, 160, Jr.; Walter Varvel, 160, Jr.; Frank Litterst, 180, Sr.; David Parsons, 190, Jr.

THE TIGERS GAINED a 5-5 record last year but trouble will be had matching that in '63. Consolidated lacks speed, depth, experience and a good punter.

Bright spots should be the running of Litterst and Parsons, the line play of Pewthers and Gossett and the passing of Varvel.

District opposition includes state

AA runner-up Rockdale, Caldwell, Hearne, Navasota and Cameron. Rockdale is expected to repeat as district champs with Caldwell given a nod as darkhorse.

CONSOLIDATED opens its season play against Columbus of District 21-AA at Columbus Friday night. Coach Jones calls Columbus a "real fine team that will be hard to beat."

To make matters worse, the Tigers will be going into the game with their two top runners injured. Parsons has a bad knee and Litterst has an injured ankle.

Jones is assisted by Jack Churchill and Lawrence Holacek.

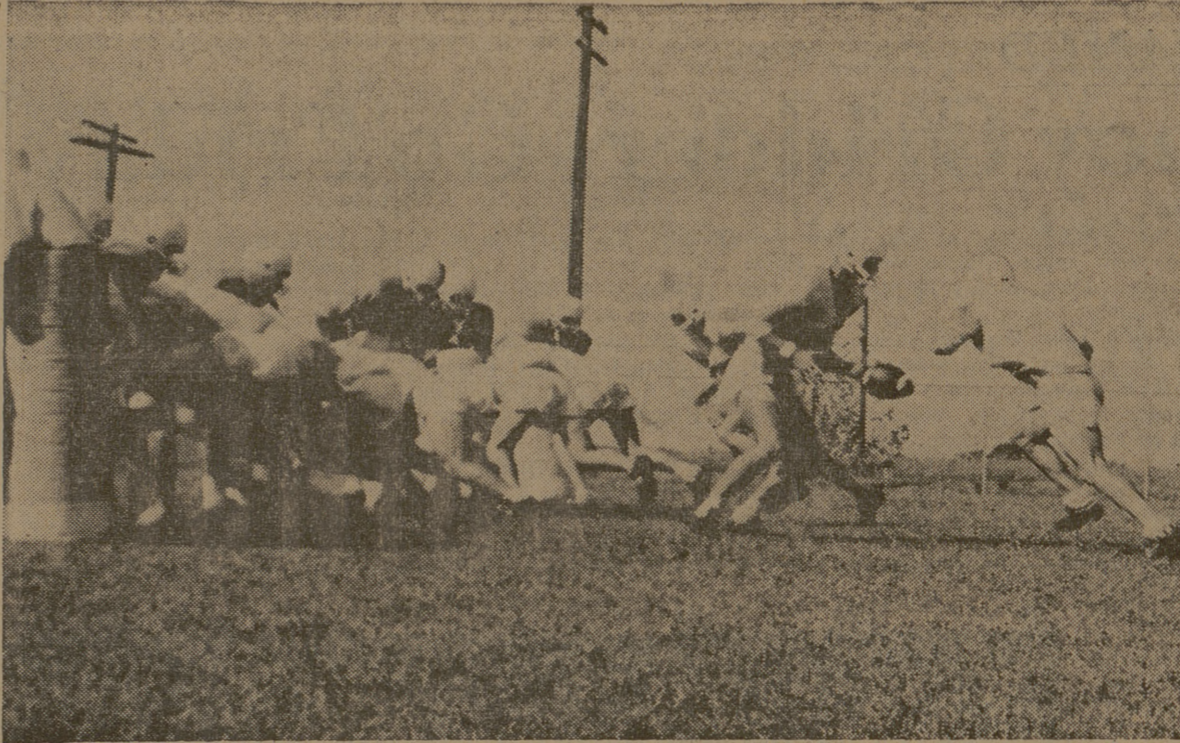
## Southwest Conference Brawl Promises 'Great' Moments

ORDINANCE NO. 279  
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE QUESTION OF REZONING THOSE PARTS OF LOTS 31 AND 32 PRESENTLY ZONED AS DISTRICT NO. 2, SECOND BUSINESS DISTRICT AND DISTRICT NO. 3, APARTMENT HOUSE DISTRICT, IN THE D. A. SMITH SUBDIVISION, TO DISTRICT NO. 4, FIRST BUSINESS DISTRICT.  
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of College Station, Texas: WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended that that land described herein be rezoned as District No. 4, First Business District, it is hereby ordered that a public hearing shall be held in the City Hall at 7:00 P. M. on September 23, 1963, on rezoning certain areas within the city limits, more particularly described as follows:
