Following Foldberg's comments, Mike Marlow, head yell leader, and Royce Knox led the Class of '64 in two yells.

expected, there was plenty of food for the large turnout, J. Gordon Gay, co-ordinator of religious life at A&M, provided the menu of steaks, potato salad, baked beans

and tea. The steak fry was scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. but got off to a late start due to an extended practice by the team.
