Both Duncan and Sbisa Hall kitchens are being equipped with the Qualheim electro-cut vegetable cutter and slicer machines in the modernization of campus kitchen equipment, Frank F. Nugent, director of food service, said.

One man can use a machine to slice all of the french fries for a dining hall or to prepare all of the lettuce, Nugent said.

The machine measures less than 38-inches in any dimension and weighs 152 pounds. Its capacity in 60 seconds is to cut or slice 12 pounds of french fries, 20 pounds of soup stocks, 15 pounds of cabbage slaw and similar amounts of other vegetables.
