

Schoolboy Football Shows Increase

ANYWAY, Texas schoolboy football will show a new high in

membership next season—946 schools. The increase of 10 over this year comes in the upper classes where new schools are being built faster than consolidations are removing some of the smaller schools.

three in Wichita Falls today. Wichita Falls failed to win its district title last year. This season it is rather lightly regarded in the state race.

Abilene ran up the national winning streak in the middle fifties. But another high school was built there. Now Abilene will do well to win its district championship.

PERHAPS this is the best way to solve the problem of domination. Thinking back to the days when the little towns had to compete with the cities that had only one high school, it never occurred to anybody that there could be any other way for equal competition than to classify the schools according to size. But the thing has taken care of itself.

Dumas probably will control Class AAA until another high school is built there.
