Rain Could Washout Baylor Aerial Circus

"Rain don't go away
Come again on Saturday
Don Trull is tough to match
But wet footballs are hard to catch."

When fall rains starts at Aggie land, raincoat prices go up, the drill field sprinkler system is turned on and architect students start planning arcs.

But football coaches turn an eye to the overcast sky, smile and remember that the circus is coming to town. The circus being the Baylor Bears featuring the aerial artistry of Don Trull.

The main attraction is scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. on Kyle Field. Along with the usual cast of Baptists, Coach John Bridgers will also bring a share of the Southwest Conference lead with him. Baylor and Texas are on top with 2-0 records.

A&M HAS an 0-1-1 record in league play and 1-3-1 on the year. Baylor is 3-1 for the season.

The Bears come the closest of any conference team to being a patsy for the Aggies. In 49 contests, A&M has won 37, lost 7 and tied 7. The Cadets defeated a Trull-guided Baylor team in Waco last year, 6-3.

"Last year our line got through," Aggie Coach Hank Foldberg explained. "We hope to do the same thing Saturday."

THERE IS little doubt that

A&M's line play will hold the key to victory against the high-flying Bears. A&M's first two lines will have three seniors, six juniors and five sophomores.

The Aggies rank second only to Texas in pass defense, but Foldberg feels that fact means little against Baylor.

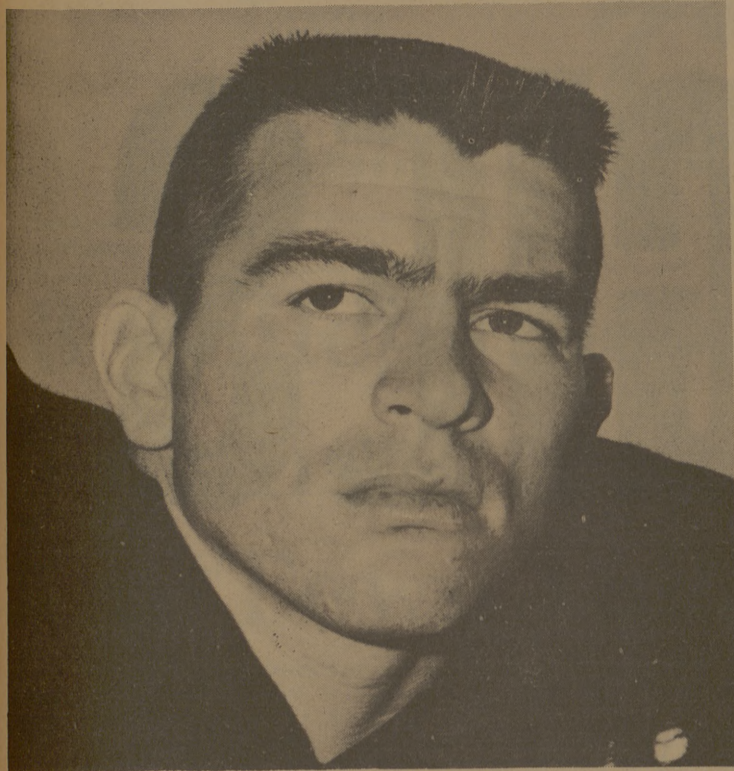
"Trull is a different type of quarterback than we've faced this year. He throws from a pocket and gets rid of the ball real fast. He'll put a lot of pressure on our secondary."

ONE FACTOR that may work in A&M's favor beside the possibility of a soggy day, is the fact that this will be Baylor's first day game. Trull will be performing his magic in unadulterated daylight instead of the manufactured

brightness of their four previous tilts.

The Aggie lineup will be the same as against TCU with the exception of the left guard slot. Sophomore John Nilson has moved up to the starting unit replacing Mike Swan. Swan sustained a bruised thigh against the Horned Frogs and will be out indefinitely.

Fish Team Strong For Cross Country

The freshman cross country team will open the season Friday, 3 p.m., with a dual meet against the Texas Shorthorns at the A&M cross country course.

Track Coach Charlie Thomas calls this team one of the strongest in A&M history. The team is led by three outstanding runners. The four top runners are all expected to run under 10:00 for the two mile distance, faster than any on the varsity.

"Geoffrey Earl of Midland, Don Smith of Fort Worth and Danny Clifton of Valley View are about

equal and are fighting it out for the No. 1 slot on the team," Thomas said.

Earl won first in both the Class 4A mile and cross country state meets. Smith placed second in 4A cross country meet. Clifton won state in the Class B mile.

Fourth man on the team is Johnny Cosper of Edna. Bob Smith of El Paso will be the fifth runner. Smith placed 11th in the 4A cross country.

Sixth and seventh spots on the team are still being contested.
