COMPANY DINNER

- Roast Duck with Stuffing
- Brown Rice Broccoli
- Spicy Grape Jelly Rolls
- Ice Cream and Sherbet

SPICE GRAPE JELLY

- 3 pounds (about) fully-ripe Concord grapes
- 1/4 cup cider vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon each ground cinnamon and ground cloves
- 5/8 cups sugar
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 box (1 1/2 ounces) powdered fruit pectin

Crush thoroughly the grapes; turn into a jelly cloth (use 4 thicknesses of damp cheesecloth for this) and squeeze out juice. Measure 2 3/4 cups juice into a large mixing bowl. Stir in the vinegar, cinnamon and cloves. Add the sugar; mix well. In a small saucepan mix together the water and powdered pectin; bring to a boil and boil 1 minute, stirring constantly. Stir into juice mixture; continue stirring about 3 minutes. (Don't worry about the few remaining sugar crystals.) Quickly pour into glasses; cover at once with tight lids. When jelly is set, store in freezer. If you plan to use a jar within a few weeks, it may be refrigerator-stored. Makes eight 8-ounce glasses.
