Take Another Look, Please

It is unfortunate that the Executive Committee was compelled by a University regulation to deny recognition to the Young Democrats and the Young Republicans as official organizations on campus.

We feel that such a regulation does not coincide with the goals of excellence which have been established for A&M University. We feel sure that the people responsible for the regulations which blocked the recognition of the two clubs had no intention of impairing the progress of the University.

If the two clubs have as their purposes to educate themselves-and that is their claim-then we feel that they have a place on the University campus. If the two clubs do not engage in "partisan politics" they would give students interested in the two political parties opportunities to prepare themselves to take a responsible position in the politics of

their communities after graduation. We feel that political clubs on the campus for the purpose of educating their members would be much better for the University than clubs off the campus, which might not be so well kept. We also feel it would be better to have our students meeting on campus, in a University recognized organization, than have the students become engaged in outside organizations which will most definitely become envolved in partisan politics.

Members of the Executive Committee, please try to find a place on our campus for our students, even at the cost of revising an unfortunate regulation.




