

Maj. Wolf Retires; Assumes Role As Extension Worker

Maj. Kenneth Wolf of the Department of Air Science has retired from the Air Force after more than 24 years of service and crossed the campus to continue his new career.

Wolf, a native of Johnson City, had been on leave from the Air Force since Sept. 1 when he assumed his new duties with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in agricultural economics. His assignment is to establish a program in agribusiness, the off-farm businesses which link to agriculture.

WOLF'S ASSIGNMENT for three years as an officer with the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps Detachment at A&M involved primary responsibility for classroom instruction of third year students. The students study leadership and management.

At the same time he has studied for a Ph.D. degree in agricultural economics with three-fourths of the work completed.

A Certificate of Retirement was presented to Wolf by Col. James F. Starkey, professor of air science and commander of the Air Force ROTC detachment.

THE CEREMONY in Col. Starkey's office ended Wolf's service career which began Oct. 17, 1939. Wolf had completed high school in Johnson City, where his mother, Mrs. Addie Maddox Wolf, still lives.

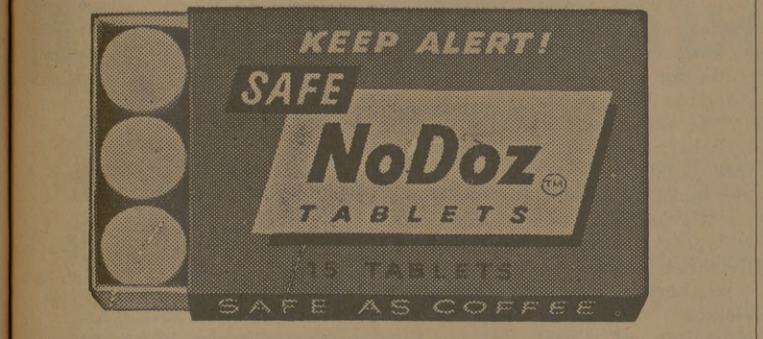
Wolf held all enlisted grades before being advanced to warrant officer May 20, 1943. After holding both grades as warrant officer, he was commissioned a second lieutenant early in 1949.

WOLF COMPLETED the BBA degree at Baylor University in 1955 and received the Master of Business Administration degree from Texas A&M in 1961.

His awards include the American Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, American Defense Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Air Force Reserve Service Medal, Medal for Humane Action (Berlin Airlift) and the Army of Occupation Medal (Germany) with Berlin Airlift Device.

Police School Sees Counterfeiting Film

A firm-lecture on counterfeiting was presented at the A&M University police training school Friday by Lane Bertram of Houston, a supervising agent with the United States Secret Service.

Bertram told the officers that the amount of counterfeit money being circulated today is less than one one-hundredth of one per cent, as compared with one of three dollars in 1865 when the federal agency was established.

The speaker also said the introduction of electronic equipment will help curb illegal check cashing throughout the United States. Handwriting samples can be sent to district offices in a matter of seconds.

Bertram urged the policemen to contact a district office when a person is caught cashing a bad check or when one is passed.

"In most cases," he said, "this person is working with a large group, and our office may be looking for the same person."

Bertram showed the students how to identify counterfeit bills and discussed other types of illegal and forged instruments.

Area Jaycees Sponsor Film About Politics

A film entitled "Freedom in Action" was shown at the meeting of the Bryan-College Station Junior Chamber of Commerce Thursday, pointing out the dangers of political apathy on the parts of citizens of the United States, reported Sam Sharp, who was in charge of the meeting.

The film was shown before an audience composed of members of the Brazos County Bar Association, the Business and Professional Women's Club, the Junior Chamber of Commerce, the Kiwanis Club, the Lions Club and the Rotary Club. Sharp said that the film showed the importance and power of the precinct on the American political scene.

This film is the first in a series of five which the Jaycees are planning to show. The other films are "Freedom and Fairness," which deals with competition and free enterprise; "Our Constitutional Republic," which deals with the origin of the principles on which the United States was founded; "The Nature of Freedom," which shows that personal freedoms are inseparable from economic freedoms, and "Protecting Freedom with Action," which shows that the power of the government comes from the people.

The Jaycees will keep this film for two weeks and anyone who has the facilities may contact an officer of the Jaycees and show the film, Sharp said.

Turkey Industry Day Is Wednesday

The annual Texas Turkey Industry Day will be held Wednesday in the Ballroom of the Memorial Student Center. George H. Draper, chairman of the program committee, said that this meeting will draw men from all aspects of the turkey industry to College Station.

On Nov. 5th there will be three conferences held prior to the main meeting. These conferences will be held by the Texas Poultry Improvement Association, the Texas Turkey Federation, and the Text-Best Turkeys Corporation.

Speeches will range from the mixing of feeds to the ever present sanitation problem.

The high point in the meeting will be a speech by Dr. F. L. Chermis, associate professor in the Department of Poultry Science, at the University of Wisconsin. His speech will cover "The Application of New Techniques for Improving Fertility."
