Let's Cut Injury Rate

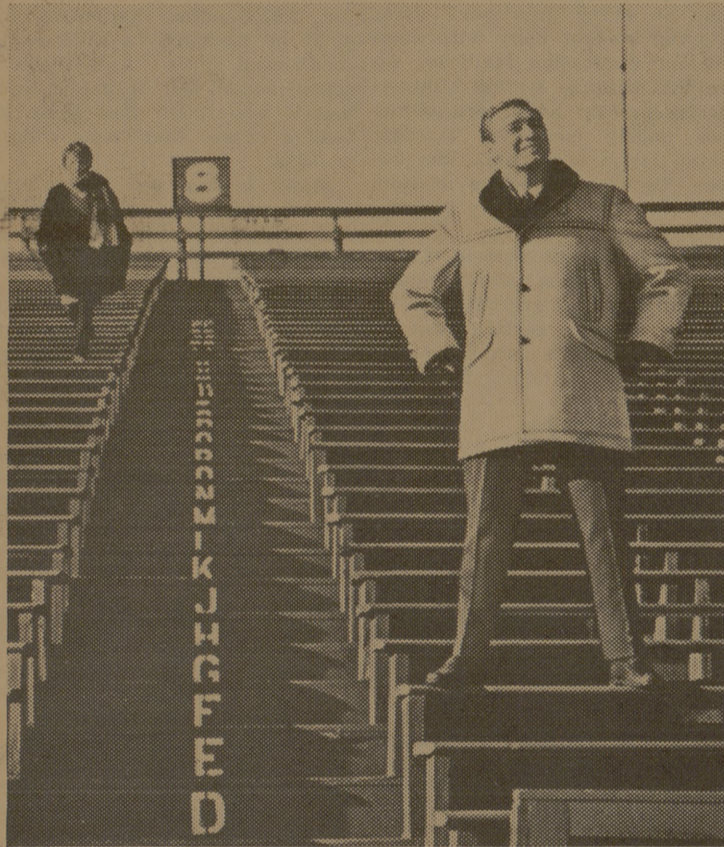

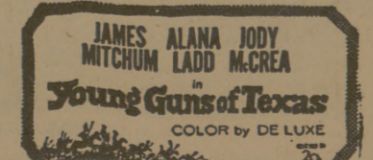
