BY JACK HAND Associated Press Sports Writer NEW YORK (AP) — American League club owners are expected to turn down Charles O. Finley's request to move the Athletics franchise from Kansas City to Louisville at special meetings here Thursday.

At least five clubs—New York, Baltimore, Chicago, Detroit and Boston—are opposed, according to an Associated Press survey. In fact, Fetzer pointed out in Detroit before leaving for New York that "there are precepts in the by-laws of the American League constitution which say that the league may take over any franchise which is not being operated according to that constitution. I think those precepts may apply in this case."

Stadium. Finley went to Louisville and signed with Kentucky officials after a meeting with Gov. Edward T. Breathitt. Kansas City officials are up in arms. Sen. Stuart Symington, D-Mo.; Mayor Ilius Davis of Kansas City; Senator James Pearson, R-Kan., and others have said they will attend the New York meeting.

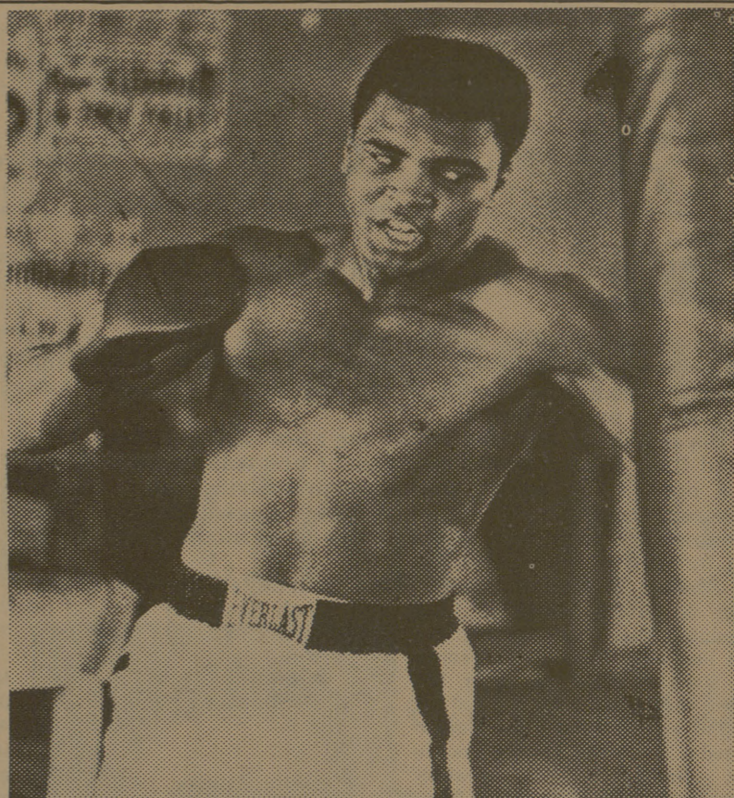
