Norman Joins Ags On Friends' Advice

When Ken Norman graduated from Lon Morris Junior College after helping them to a 25-4 record, he was undecided between offers from Arkansas and A&M. Some friends of Ken's from UT suggested that he would like Aggie land better.

So Norman enrolled at A&M and

found he did like Aggie land. And it didn't take long for the Aggies to find that they liked Ken.

With the Cadet eagles playing so many road games early in the season, Norman was relatively unknown to fans until the Aggies played Texas in Austin. Ken came off the bench in the second half to score two crucial buckets that enabled the Maroon to beat the Steers 65-60 for their first win in Austin since 1959.

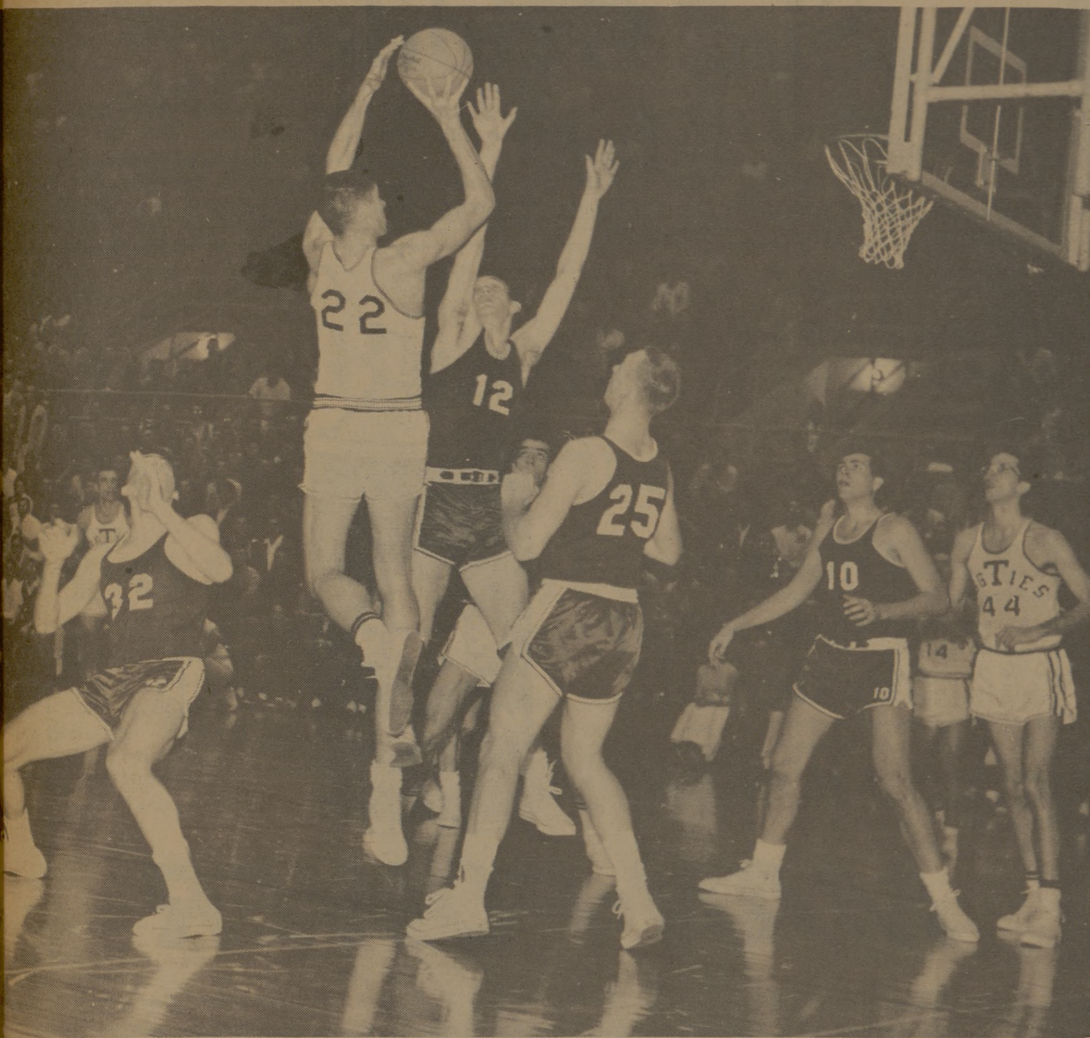
