

The A&M University Nuclear Science Center is training 17 marine engineers to operate the atomic-powered ship Savannah tied up at Galveston.

The training period began last week and will continue through Wednesday.

John D. Randall, associate head of the Nuclear Science Center and in charge of the training program, said the purpose of the instruction is to help qualify the engineers for Atomic Energy Commission licenses to operate the Savannah.

After their training here, the men will take operator license examinations on the ship in March.

Randall said A&M is conducting the training program under contract with Babcock and Wilcox, a nuclear power firm which has offices in Galveston. The firm has contracts with the AEC and the U. S. Maritime Commission to put the ship back into operation.

Dr. Robert G. Cochran, head of the Department of Nuclear Engineering, negotiated the contract with Babcock and Wilcox.
