In the concluding quarter hour,

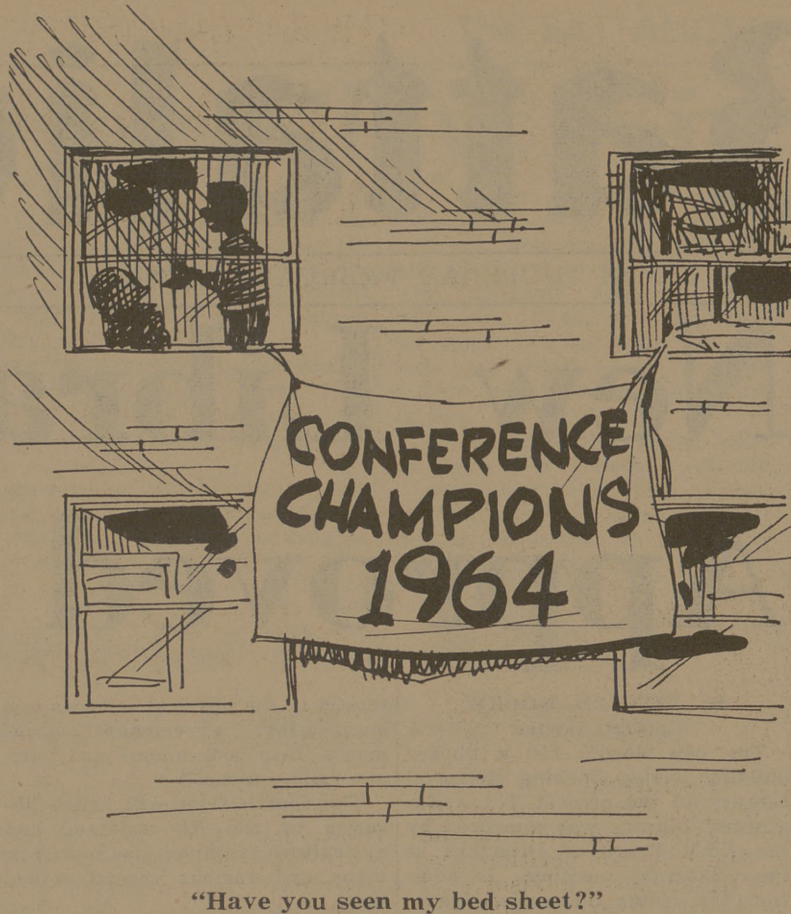
a practice session will be held in which participants will try to read gross meanings into everyday situations.

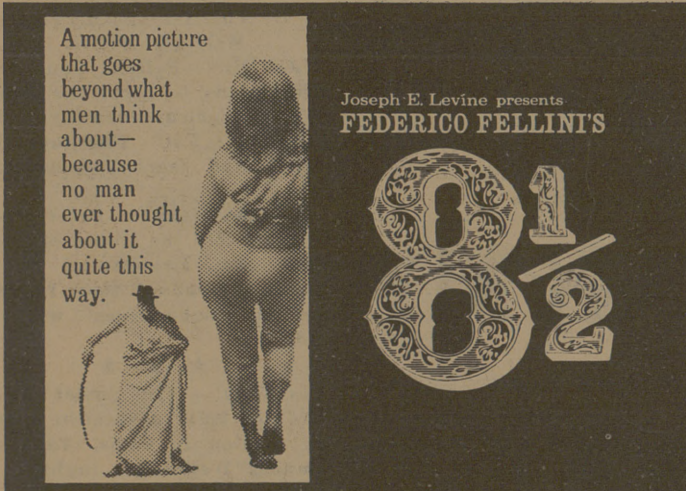
