
Ever since I came to A&M I a practice session will be held in which participants will try to read gross meanings into everyday situations.

Rights Bill On Calendar

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted 54 to 37 Wednesday to keep the House-passed omnibus civil rights bill on the Senate calendar and ready for further action.

The vote was a victory for the strategy of the Democratic leadership in dealing with the hotly controversial legislation.

The roll call came on a motion of Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, D-Mont., to table and thus kill an appeal of Sen. Richard B. Russell, D-Ga., from a presiding officer's ruling that the measure must remain on the calendar.

Russell, the leader of the Southern forces heavily opposed to the bill, had made the point of order that the measure must go to committee.

But San. Lee Metcalf, D-Mont., presiding at the time, rejected the point of order.

Russell then was able to win a recorded test on the matter by making his appeal.


