Waco Site Of Varsity Meet

A crippled Aggie track team will venture to Waco Saturday for a quadrangular meet with the Baylor Bears, Texas Longhorns and Southern Methodist Mustangs. Missing from action in the four-way competition will be Jerry Anderson, mile relay and 440-yard dash specialist, Pat Mitchell, sprinter and relay man, and sprinter Robert Martin. All three men are nursing pulled muscles and sore legs.

Weight man Danny Roberts will have another chance at Baylor's shot put twins, Jim Lancaster and Frank Mazza. All three men have beaten each other at least once this spring. Roberts won the Border Olympics in Laredo, Mazza the San Angelo Relays, and Lancaster the Texas Relays.

THE LAST TIME the moon sat in on a game, the Cadets trounced Texas Tech 12-2 so the Ags would

like to give the night light an encore against the Frogs.

Tom Chandler's crew donated an earlier contest to TCU in Fort Worth. A&M committed six errors while dropping a 14-7 decision.

THE MAROON ARE one-half game behind co-leaders Baylor and Texas in the SWC race. The Aggies are 3-2 in league play and 9-5 for the season. TCU stands 2-2.

Chuck McGuire gets the call for opening mound duty. TCU Coach Frank Windeger will probably go with Pat Peebles.

TCU WILL lineup with Bob Sanders, rf; Fred Jones, c; Jay Walrath, lf; Ronnie McClain, 3b; Bob Bigley, cf; Sammy Reynolds, 1b; Mike Justice, 2b; J. W. Holt, ss; and Peebles, p.

A&M, on a three-game win skein, will counter with Jerry Ballard, ss; Bill Grochett, 2b; Billy Crain, rf; Allen Koonce, lf; Bill Hancock, c; Lance Cobb, cf; Frank Stark, 1b; George Hargett, 3b; and McGuire, p.

THE TWO TEAMS meet again Saturday in Travis Park. Game time will be 2 p.m.

The Cadets are swinging lusty bats with seven players hitting over .300 after five SWC games. Cobb is leading the regulars with a great .556. The sophomore centerfielder also shows the most total bases with 20 and RBI's with 5. Of his 10 hits, four have been doubles and two were home runs.

Hargett, Stark and Koonce are hitting an even .500 with Hancock at .444.

Soph lefty Steve Hillhouse sports the best earned run average with 0.90. John Crain is undefeated with three wins.

After an impressive win over Rice and Texas in a previous tri-meet, by a score of 75 for A&M to 40½ for Texas and 37½ for Rice, and a commendable showing at the Texas Relays, the Fish will be after another victory.

A&M lost its first conference match with the Rice Owls, 5-1. Coach Omar Smith's net men carry a 7-4 season mark.

The Tech Red Raiders will play Don Draper of Houston, Beau Sutherland of Kerrville, Robert Peterson of Wichita Falls and Greer Kothman of Junction.

The Aggies will use the same lineup against Pan American and will feature Williams and Barker as the No. 1 combination while Contreras and Rojas make up the No. 2 combination for the Aggies.

12th Man Bowl Sees Cadets Beat Civilians

Paul Crank's 23 points led the Corps to a 53-40 win over Civilians in the second annual 12th Man Bowl basketball game Tuesday night in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

Action started with the Corps getting a small lead half through the initial period. A jump by non-reg Henry Boxley led the Civilians in front 11-7 three minutes left. But buckets Cadets Bob Sims, Crank and Richard Englebret put the Corps in reach of a lead.

The Corps managed to pull front when Crank hit a jump shot with a second to go before the end of the first quarter, making the score 16-15.
