

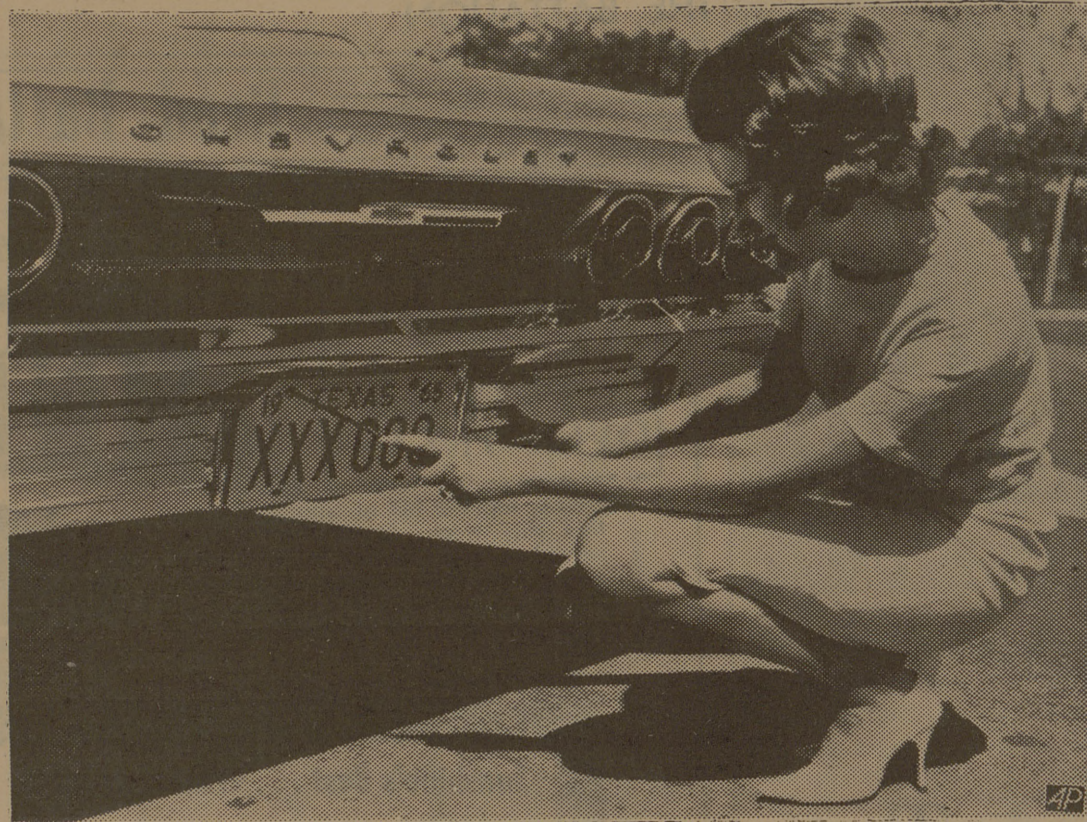

**Rev Only Female Who Has 201 File**

Despite the entrance of over 200 Maggies to A&M this year, the only female on campus on whom the Trigon keeps an accurate, up-to-date 201 File is our four-legged female mascot, Reveille.  
Rev's file is different from the confidential 201 File the Department of Military Science keeps on each cadet, though. This file can be seen by anyone so desiring. It contains pictures, newspaper clippings and magazine articles done on Reveille and her earlier counterpart, Reveille I, dating back to the 1930's.  
The file was initiated by Mrs. Juanita H. Baker, now a receptionist in the Office of the Commandant and then 201 File clerk. Mrs. Baker started it in 1952 when Reveille II was a puppy to accommodate people who write A&M from across the state and nation requesting information on Aggie's famous canine mascot, said Mrs. Elizabeth Cook, secretary to the Commandant.  
Like that of many a fun-loving cadet, Rev's disciplinary record in the form of newspaper clippings, etc.) contains quite a few instances of misconduct. One such occasion was in the 1950's when she bit TCU coach Walter Roach during her half-time performance (punishment—she was muzzled the rest of the season) and several times she publicly displayed her contempt of other school's gridiron (punishment—she was put on a leash for several games, much against her will).  
Her file also gives her medical record (date of birth, family, etc.) and her academic standing (Rev was once enrolled in B.A. 428 and the professor, Judge S. C. Hoyt placed her name on the class rolls—she would answer with a bark).  
The file shows that she has good many likes and dislikes (she enjoys classes, strangely enough, and hates co-eds. She also likes her two cans of dog food per day but turns her nose up at the best food from Duncan Mess Hall).  
Her Corps "buddy" rating is excellent and she leads a very active social life, enjoying many extra-curricular activities such as Corps Trips, football games, B&W views and water fights.  
Judging from Rev's history the past 12 years, one begins to wonder if the "dog's life" she leads is such a bad life after all.

**Corpus Christi Drawers Win State Contest**

Corpus Christi high school students drew their way to top honors in the 22nd annual Texas Drawing Contest sponsored by A&M University.  
The statewide contest attracted 8,000 entries from nearly 200 schools. The contest was held on campus and judging was by the Department of Engineering Graphics.

Patrick Garcia also took first place in the pictorial drawing division. Others in this division were: 2nd - John Nesloney, Highlands High School, San Antonio; 3rd - Don Hay, Van High School, Van, and Joe Nelson, North Dallas High School, Dallas.

Extension Service Studying Business  
The Texas Agricultural Extension Service is conducting demonstrations in business management principles for agriculture-related business firms.  
The sessions are known as the Agribusiness Management Institute.  
Extension Economist Kenneth Wolf of the A&M University Department of Agricultural Economics and Sociology is directing the 18-hour program in Waco. Twenty-seven farm supply store operators and seed dealers from Bell, Bosque, Coryell, Falls, Hill, Limestone and McLennan Counties are participating.  
Institute sponsors are the Texas Seedmen's Association, Texas Certified Seed Producers, Waco Chamber of Commerce and the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.  
Wolf said instructors have been drawn from the wholesale and retail seed trade, banking, insurance and manufacturing firms in addition to A&M personnel.  
The institute began on April 14. Sessions will continue from 7:30 to 9:30 each Tuesday and Thursday night through May 12.
