CRISIS IN EDUCATION Study Reveals Teenage Views

Contrary to popular belief, most teenage girls consider being welldressed important, according to recent research at A&M Universi-

This attitude helps rule out "ultra casual" dressing and "fad" buying, say researchers with the Department of Home Economics at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station.

Information for the study came from 471 girls of junior and senior high schools in Bryan, College Station, Dallas and Fort Worth. Similar interviews were given to their mothers to compare the two groups in certain instances.

Although the girls thought that quantity of clothing was important, they showed more interest in clothing suitable to their activities and becoming to them individually. They wanted to dress similar to their peers, but they also wanted to express their personalities through clothing choices.




