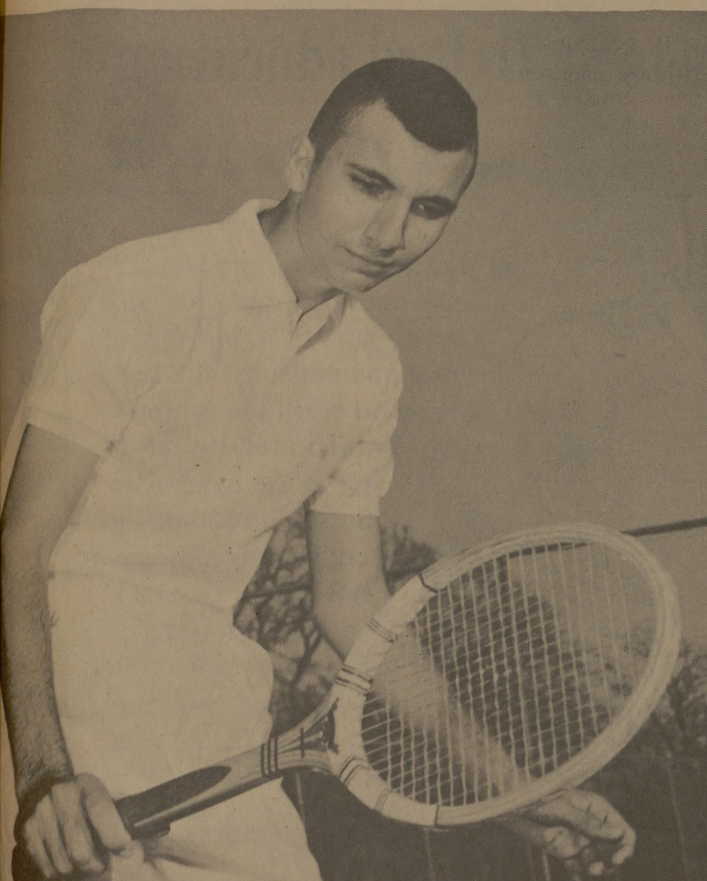
Wes Robinson leads the region in tie-down roping while Jones is second in the region in bulldogging.

Admission to the performances is adults, \$1.25; students, \$1; and children, 50 cents.

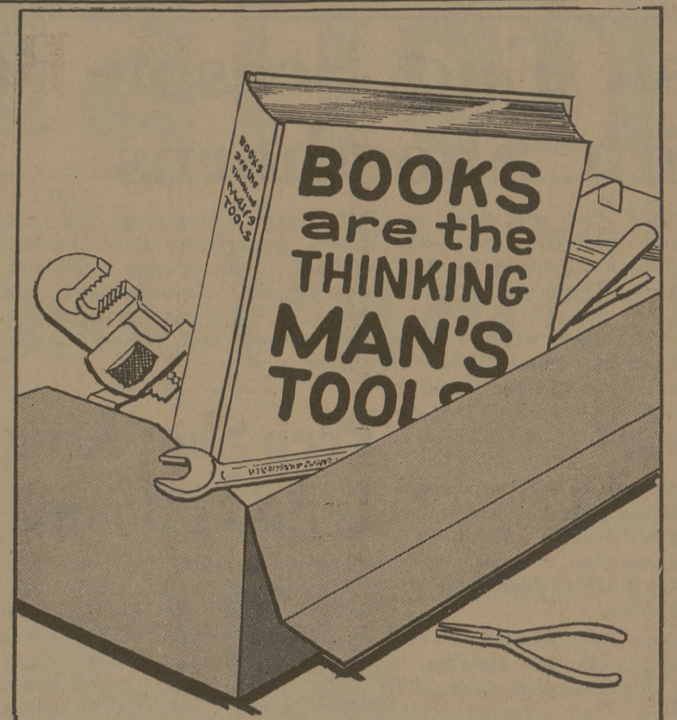
This year's Aggie rodeo sweetheart is Sonja Oliphant of Potett.
