

Police Supervisor School Opens For 2-Week Study

Forty-nine policemen from five states enrolled Monday in a two-week training school for supervisors at A&M University.

Paul Dixon and Paul Hasskarl of Northwestern University's Traffic Institute will provide the instruction.

The school is co-sponsored by A&M, Northwestern and the Inter-

national Association of Police Chiefs.

Police supervisors attending the school will be presented certificates if they successfully complete class assignments and score satisfactorily on examinations, Dixon pointed out.

"Our goal will be to equip each of these officers with knowledge and skills so he can perform more

efficiently as a police supervisor," Dixon added.

Humble Oil and Refining Company of Houston provides \$1,500 worth of scholarships for the school.

Korean Byung Don Lee, a doctoral student in oceanography, will learn some Spanish as well as collect small marine creatures during a cruise to Antarctica this month.

He will be aboard an Argentine vessel to supervise oceanographic observations and to collect zooplankton for his doctoral dissertation.

Lee leaves here Monday on his trip to Antarctica. On an earlier trip a friend who spoke Spanish traveled with him to Buenos Aires. "I've never had a formal course in Spanish. If they don't understand my English, I'll just speak louder," he quipped.

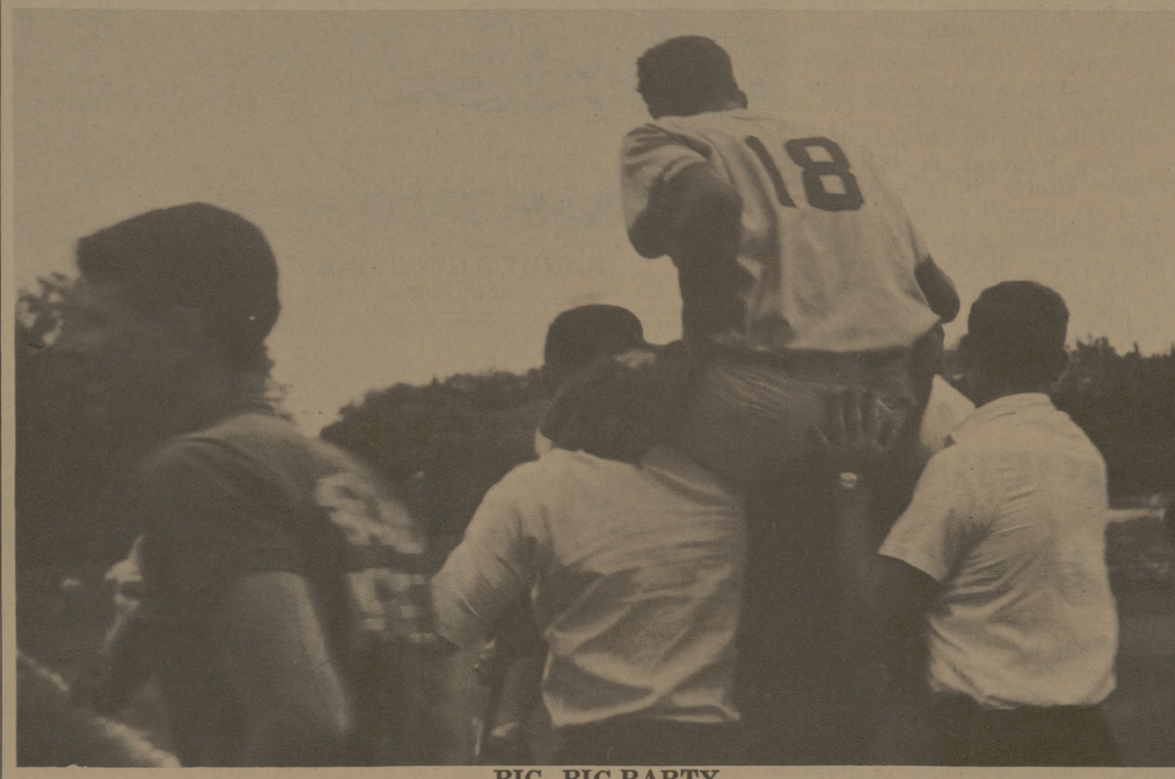
Lee will carry three Spanish phrase books with him—just in case his shouting isn't understood.

Data gained on a recent cruise of the A&M research vessel Alaminos devoted to study of the geology of the bottom of the Gulf of Mexico will be discussed in New York City this week.

A&M Research Scientist John W. Antoine will leave Wednesday to meet with Professor W. Maurice Ewing of the Lamont Geological Observatory of Columbia University. The discussions will continue for several days.
