The letter, written by Jack T. Sloan, describes how American and Pakistani Aggies organized the program. Sloan, visual aids specialist with the Agricultural Extension Service, is on leave from

A&M working with the Agency for International Development program at East Pakistan Agricultural University. The program included an invocation by Dr. Quazi Rahim, class of 1954. Sloan, class of 1934, recited the muster tradition; Doyle Graves, class of 1931, read the roll call for the absent; and Dr. Latif Mian, class of 1962, gave the closing ceremony.

Meat Institute Official Signed

A high official in the American Meat Institute Foundation in Chicago will join the A&M University Department of Animal Husbandry July 1 as a professor.

He is Dr. Wendell A. Landmann, chief of the Division of Analytical and Physical Chemistry of the AMIF.

Dr. O. D. Butler, head of the Department of Animal Husbandry, said the scientist's transfer to the university is "part of our continuing effort here to integrate programs on beef research from conception to consumption."

"Dr. Landmann is an established leader in the field of meats chemistry," Butler said. "He has 45 technical articles to his credit, many of which relate directly to the research program he will be conducting here."

The department head said Landmann will work on such research as comparing chemical characteristics of tender and tough beef muscle fibers. He will then attempt to determine causes and genetical pathways leading to higher palatability beef production.

Wallace D. Beasley, chief of A&M University's Police Training School, will be one of the featured speakers at the Texas Police Association's meeting in El Paso June 16.

More than 350 police officials throughout Texas are expected to attend. Subject of Beasley's talk will be the "Challenge to Police Training Today."

Dr. Davis A. Fahquist of A&M University will participate in a

seismic reflection study of the Mediterranean Sea's underwater surfaces this summer.

Fahquist, assistant professor of geology and geophysics, spent three previous summers attempting to solve mysteries surrounding underwater land belts in the Mediterranean.

His doctoral dissertation shows results of seismic reflections of the underwater land areas. Other search scientists will be involved in various other studies during the cruise.

Fahquist will join scientists in Turkey about mid-June for a six to eight-week passage through the western portion of the Mediterranean.

His work is being sponsored by the Office of Naval Research. He will return to A&M in mid-August.

Dr. Grady P. Parker, A&M University science educator, is listed in the newly-published "Who's Who in America." Parker's interests are reflected in his activities in scientific and educational associations at the state and national level.

In 1940 he joined the A&M chemistry faculty and served for eight years before transferring to the Department of Education and Psychology.

Professor Parker is a fellow of the Texas Academy of Science and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. W. B. Davis and Jerome Mankins of A&M University Department of Wildlife Management will be among a limited number of Americans attending classes in Costa Rica this summer.

They will take a biology course on the evolution of tropical plants at the University of Costa Rica. The classes are sponsored by the Organization for Tropical Studies, a scientific and educational corporation formed by a group of American educational institutions.

The entire Republic of Costa Rica serves as the classroom and laboratory for the July 6 through August 28 study.

Davis, head of wildlife management, for several years has conducted several research projects in Latin American countries, including a current three-year free-tailed bat study.

He feels that more knowledge about the development of tropical plants may solve some of the mysteries about the guano bats.

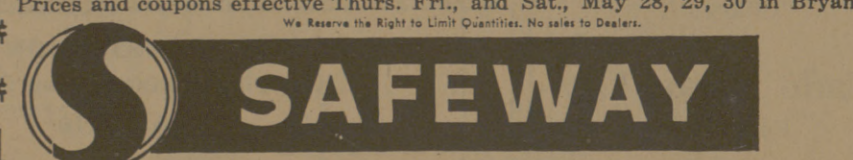
