TTI Awarded \$7,500 Grant

A grant of \$1,500 for research on lightweight concrete has been made to the Texas Transportation Institute by the Expanded Shale Clay and Slate Institute through Frank G. Erskine, its managing director.

The research will deal with the diagonal tension resistance of lightweight aggregate concrete beams and slabs, according to Charles J. Keese, executive officer of the Texas Transportation Institute. The work will be conducted at the A&M Research Annex by staff members of the Department of Structural Research of the Institute with Dr. Don L. Ivy in charge.

The first phase will involve checking the ASTM procedure for split cylinder testing, and the second phase will consist of testing full scale beams and slabs to correlate their diagonal tension resistance with split cylinder tests. Results are expected to have application in highway, bridge and building construction.




